ENDORSE MOVE OF TEXAS BRANCH OF AMERICAN COT-TON ASSOCIATION TO REDUCE COTTON ACREAGE ONE-THIRD DURING COMING YEAR 1921.

A county-wide move is on to reduce the cotton acreage in McCulloch county during the coming year, 1921, 33 1-3%—the move being in co-operation with the universal one-third reduction advocated by the Texas branch of the American Cotton association throughout the cotton growing states of the South. This move has already become widespread, and has as its purpose the limiting of the cotton acreage by the substitution of other crops. W. D. Crothers is chairman of the move in McCulloch county.


