Since the printing of our ad in last weeks papers many questions that the voters have a right to be enlightened upon have come up and in this space we will endeavor to answer the more important questions that have arisen.

As to where the roads will be built we believe that a statement from the Commissioners Court is the best authority to be had and we herewith present a statement signed by the County Judge and each of the four Commissioners explaining this matter in detail.
"A report is being circulated that Mcc culloch county has but one designated highway-the Puget Sound to the Gult- and that alit the s500, ooo road bond funds are to be expended on this one highway. This, report is without foundation, and in order to get the matter before the eoters. the Com missioners
are issuing the following statement, and all statements to the contrary are without toundation: "Highway No, 9 -The Puget Sound to the Gulf-enters the county at Doole. comes by way of
Salt Gap, Melvin, West Sweden, Brady and Camp San Saba, to the Mason county line; a total of 40 In addition to the above it will also serve Stacy, being only 5 miles to that town.
"Highway Noo 10-Fort Worth-Brady-Fort Stockton-passes through the towns of Milburn, Merury, Placid, Rochele, East Sweden, Brady, Calf Creek to the Menard county line

"Highway No. 23-Southwest Trail-Comes from the Coleman county line by Waldrip, Lohn and

routes cannot be eviven until we rare eady to buid and the engineers have made their surves, estimates,

"We believe that we can safely say that there is no county in the State (unless it has a city) that is blessed with Highways like Mcculloch county, nor one whose highways come as near serving ail the
people as ours do. You will notice from the above that out of 20 voting boxes in the county, 16 are diveotly benefrted by the hishways. Of the other fonr, Whitelands p position cannot be definitely stated
fer until the exact location of Highway No. 9 is determined, but it is the intention to give this community a
graded road either direct to Brady or to Highway No. 9 .
Whe other three boxes, Voca, Mt. Tabor and Lost Creek are not on a highway and it was our knowledge of this fact that primarily caused us to suggest that another 8100.000 be add
tion for this election, and it is our intention to build them a hard surface road to Brady.
"According to figures we have before us, it is our opinion and that of our engineer, that the 100 miles of highway can be built for 86,000 per mile with Government aid, this will take only 8300,000
of the bond issue for the highways and will leave 3300 ooo for other roads with which we can conneet not only the communities mentioned herein, but every other community in the county, with a highway by a first-class road.

## How Will the Roads Be Maintained?

A statement seems to have gained considerable circulation in the county that it will take all of the road money available in the county to keep up the highways once they have been built and that there will be nothng left for the other roads. To show that this impression is erroneous the following facts are given:

The present maintenance tax brings in a little over $\$ 27,000$ each year. The auto tax brings in for the counties part, $\$ 5,000$. The Federal and state government required a pledge of $\$ 150$ per mile main-
tenance annually on the mile and one half of road just completed on the Brady-Mason road. On this tenance annualy maintenance on the 100 miles of highways contemplated will be $\$ 15,000$. The auto tax will give us $\$ 5,000$ of this, leaving $\$ 10,000$ to be taken out of the 30 c tax and there will be left $\$ 17$,000 to go on the other roads each year, which is as much or more than they are now getting, or have
gotten for years. This can be verified by any county commissioner, who has the supervision of these roads.

This will answer the mistaken idea that has gotten out that it will take all our money to keep these oads in repair after they they are built

## Who Can Vote?

A question has also arisen as to who will be entitled to vote. The law on elec tions of this nature is that EVERY PROPERTY TAX PAYER is elligible to vote. You do not have to own real estate to vote in this election. If you pay tax on anything other than the poll tax you may vote.

## Swat The ROAD BONDS

If you ever want any good roads in McCul loch county, vote against the road bonds.

Your taxes are already very heavy, and if you do not want them almost doubled vote against the road bonds.

If you do not want to keep your nose and the noses of your descendants to the grind stone for the payment of useless and wasted taxes or the next thirty years, vote against the road bonds.

If you do not want $\$ 600,000.00$ of the people's money, with interest for the balance of our lives squandered, vote against the road bonds.

The best that those who want the bonds can promise is one road through McCulloch County. That road cannot be to every place in the County, regardless of what promises have been made you about it.

If you will travel and observe some of the roads in this section of the State where large bond issues have been made you will conclude that the money was worse than squandered. Some good roads have been spoiled.

From past experience it is almost certain that a large part of the money will not be used to fix the bad places in the roads but will be used to damage the good roads.

If we issue the $\$ 600,000.00$ in bonds proposed at $5 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent interest it will take $\$ 33,000.00$ per year interest that the people will have to pay that will be gone from hem forever, together with the $\$ 600,000.00$. If we would take one-half of that amount of interest and ex-
pend it judicially each year under the supervision of some suitable party sufficient labor could bé employed and material purchased to put all our roads in traveling condition in twelve months, and in five years to have a good system of roads throughout McCulloch County. This plan would work all of the roads and leave us in condition to keep our roads in good condition and not have to pay the $\$ 600,000.00$ and only have to pay one-half of the interest we are paying on the bonds, and we could cease to pay it whenever we wanted to.

Let us all go to the polls and vote against the bonds and then get up some means that will give us all good roads at a reasonable price. If the bonds carry we will not a have a chance to have roads for 30 years.

Be sure and go to the polls and vote against the bonds.
