## \$1.00 SCHOOL TAX CONSIITUTIONAL LIMIT BOTH BONDS AND MIINTENANCE

## WLI NOT INCREASE TAX BEYOD SILOO LIMT-

The question has been raised by some of Brady's most prominent citizens as to whether or not the voting of $\$ 40,000$ bonds
for the proposed new Brady high school would result in the levying of a tax upon the citizenship in addition to the proposed $\$ 1.00$
school tax limit. The answer is: POSITIVELY NOT school tax limit. The answer is: POSITIVELY NOT. The pro-
posed $\$ 1.00$ tax limit is the greatest possible amount permitted posed $\$ 1.00$ tax limit is the greatest possible amount permitted
to be levied under the state constitution for both school bonds and school maintenance. In other words, the constitutional limit
for school taxation is $\$ 1.00$. This $\$ 1.00$ must care for all bond and for all maintenance. There can be no additional tax levied
beyond this amount. See Sec. 220, Page 88 , of 1922 School Law.
