NOW spelled backward means SUCCESS. STOP dilly-dallying. Pull yourself together. Get the reins in your hands and DRIVE. Don't follow-DRIVE.

START TODAY TO PAY YOUR BILLS. If your credit is good and you want to keep it good, pay up now.
If your bills have accumulated-are past due to such an extent you can't pay them all at once - pay as much as you can. Do your BEST. Don't get into the "DEBT DODGER" class.
No matter how small an account is, take care of it. Always remember the merchant has hundreds, probably thousands of accounts just like yours on his books. .In the aggregate they mount up.
Every honest person is enlisted upon the side of this Association because this association is fightng on the side of HONESTY.

The credit association has two main objects in view.
The first and greater is to eliminate the "dead beat"-the second is to help the man WHO PAYS HIS BILLS PROMPTLY to a greater credit.
