Wall to improve their properties on North Bridge street. According to these gentlemen, they expect to let a contract early in January for a modern structure of brick and plate glass, and which will adorn the site of the buildings at present occupied by the Express office, the Jordan & Wood grocery, the Wegner Meat market and the Davis Auto Top shop. The Express office, owned by Mr. Wall, has a frontage of 25 ft., Jordan & Wood grocery store, 35 ft., and the Crothers & Hallum building, 30 ft. In the plans for the new block, Mr. Wall would obtain 5 ft. off the Jordan & Wood property, making three store buildings of uniformly 30-ft, width. The property extends 95 ft., in depth.
