## Purifoy and Stultz In Judge Runoff

Two candidates for Runnels County Judge have another three weeks of uncertainty after no candidate received a majority of the votes cast in Saturday's Democratic primary.

B. B. (Bill) Stultz and incumbent John Purifoy will contest for the winning votes to be cast in the June 3 runoff. The winner will face Republican Woodrow Hoffman in the general election in November. Hoffman was the lone republican running in the primaries May 6.

In Saturday's voting, Judge Purifoy received 721 votes, with Stultz claiming 813.

Michael Murchison came in third with 560 votes. Don Atkins, a former longtime sheriff, was also on the ballot but died before the election. He received 30 votes.

Other county office holders who

were up for re-election this year had no opposition in the primary, and will face no Republican opposition in November. They include District Clerk Myrt Jobe; County Clerk Frankie Berryman; County Treasurer Otis Jacob; County Surveyor Felix Itz; County Commissioner Prec. 2 David Carroll; County Commissioner Prec. 4 Marvin Salling; Justice of Peace Prec. 1 Oliver Petty; Justice of Peace Prec. 2 J. C. Hodnett; Justice of Peace Prec. 6 L. C. Renken; Justice of Peace Prec. 7 Harry F. Ringle; Constable Prec. 2 Van B. Whittenburg.

County voters went handily for Cong. Bob Krueger for the U.S. Senate nomination against Joe Christie, in the Democratic Primary. Krueger received 1688 in the county, with Christie getting 400. In Winters

boxes, it was Krueger 355 and 133; Christie 63 and 23. At Wingate, Krueger 69 and Christie 23. Norton, Krueger 59 and Christie 16.

Runnels County voters went against the state grain in the governor's nomination race, picking Gov. Dolph Briscoe 1334 over John Hill, 707. In the Winters boxes, Briscoe received 256 and 100, while Hill received 172 and 50. At Wingate, Briscoe got 67, Hill 27. At Norton, Briscoe 58, Hill 19.

In the 21st District race for U.S. Representative, Nelson Wolff garnered 1026 in the county. Next highest was Woodrow Glasscock with 627. In the Winters boxes, Wolff had 206 and 86, to Glasscock's 123 and 50. Wingate voters also went for Wolff, but with a narrower margin, 36 to 34 for Glasscock.

## NR Hospital Board Says Law Suit Story Misleading

A spokesman for the board of directors of North Runnels Hospital this week said that a story published in a weekend edition of The Ballinger Ledger concerning a law suit involving North Runnels Hospital is misleading, due to absence of certain facts surrounding the case.

It is true, the spokesman said, that the case on the court docket shows that North Runnels Hospital has charged firms in Abilene and Minneapolis, Minn., with negligence in connection with a fire at the hospital July 22, 1976, involving a piece of laboratory equipment. However, it was stated, the suit was not filed by the hospital board, but by an insurance company in the name of the North Runnels Hospital, a common procedure, according to the hospital's legal counsel. The insurance company already has paid a damage claim to the hospital, and in the suit is seeking to recover damages from the two equipment firms. According to the hospital board spokesman, no one on the board, nor the hospital administration, had been notified by the insurance company that the suit had been filed, and no news medium had sought additional information concerning the case from the hospital, until Monday of this week. The published information obviously was taken from the filed petition, it was explained, and no other background

information was included. Thus, it was stated, the limited information in the article served to be misleading to those who were not fully informed about the situation.

According to the article, defendants in the case are Pako Corporation, a Minneapolis firm which manufactured the equipment involved in the fire, and X-Ray Enterprises of Abilene, which contracted June 16, 1976, to service the equipment.

The suit petition maintains that the equipment was serviced July 21, 1976. The next morning, it was said, a hospital employee turned on the equipment to heat up chemicals. Shortly afterward, a fire broke out. It was later determined, according to the petition, that no chemicals were in the machine, resulting in the heating elements causing the fire.

Plaintiff—the insurance company in the name of North Runnels Hospital—seeks to show the fire resulted from defects in material and workmanship since there was no safety switch, and from negligence by the Abilene firm.

Damages were said to amount to \$3,279.78, and under the Deceptive Trade Practices Act which provides for three times the amount of actual damages, the amount sought in the suit would be \$9,839.34, plus \$3,000 attorney fees.

The hospital board said the hospital already has received payment from the insurance company.

Warren Bryan Bell, who was employed by the Winters school about two months as head football coach and athletic director, died Wednesday afternoon of last week in a San Antonio hospital, victim of an apparent stroke.

Bell, 35, was taken to the hospital after being found by police in his motel room unconscious and moaning.

He had been traveling to Charlotte to visit his family and stopped at a San Antonio motel. Tenants in an adjoining room heard him moaning and called the police, it was reported.

Funeral services were held at 10 a.m. Friday at Charlotte First Baptist Church. Roland Doizer, pastor, officiated. Burial was at 10 a.m. Saturday at Rest Haven Cemetery in Lubbock.

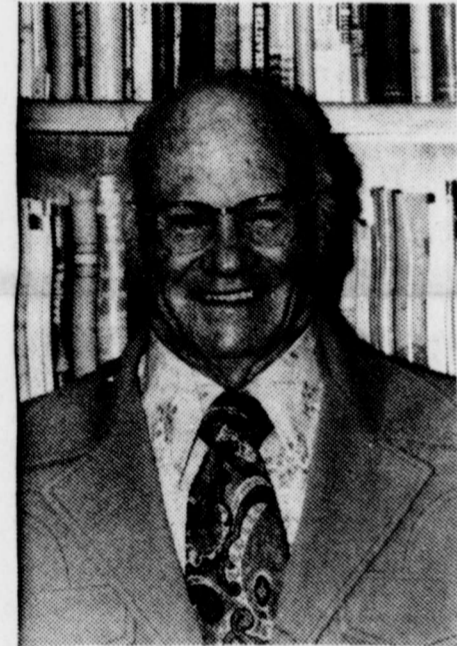

Said ordinance is on file in the office of the City Secretary and the caption of said ordinance reads as follows:

**JUNK 152CC**  
AN ORDINANCE CONTROLLING JUNK DEALERS, JUNK MOTOR VEHICLES, AND THE OPERATION OF JUNK YARDS IN THE CITY OF WINTERS, TEXAS.  
ARTICLE I—REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO JUNK DEALERS AND SECOND-HAND MATERIAL DEALERS.

Definition of terms; record requirements; inspection of records; obtaining information prior to purchase; requirement for retention and separation of junk; purchasing of junk from intoxicated persons and/or minors; examination of junk by police; posting of regulations required; restriction of location of junkyards; fencing requirements; license required; license application.  
**ARTICLE II—JUNK MOTOR VEHICLE REGULATIONS.**

Short title; definition of terms; general exceptions; junk motor vehicles deemed a public nuisance; issuance of abatement orders and removal procedures-occupied buildings; issuance of abatement orders and removal procedures-unoccupied premises; preliminary procedure to court trial; hearing of and ruling on court cases; removal procedures from unoccupied premises; compliance by granting permission for removal; evidence of abandonment; reconstruction

of vehicle prohibited; notification of highway department.

**ARTICLE I—ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF.**

Office of City Health Officer created; health and sanitation personnel; office of Sanitarian created; Sanitarian personnel.

**ARTICLE II—UNSANITARY AND UNSIGHTLY CONDITIONS OF PRIVATE PREMISES.**

Prohibited conditions designated; notice to owner to remove or remedy condition; notification procedure; correction or removal of conditions by City; filing of statement of expenses incurred; collection by lien.  
**ARTICLE III—RAT CONTROL.**

Definition of terms; rat-proofing of business buildings required; notification of and compliance by owner; notification of and compliance by occupant; maintenance; closure of occupied buildings; condemnation of unoccupied buildings; regulations on storing and keeping of foodstuffs; storage of animal feed; inspections authorized; restoration of rat-proofing after repair; reconstruction; storage of lumber and boxes.  
**ARTICLE IV—PENALTY AND SEVERABILITY.**

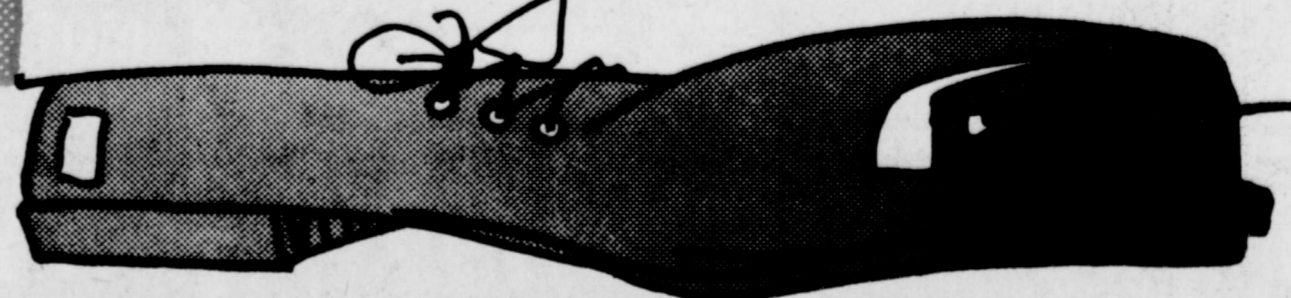

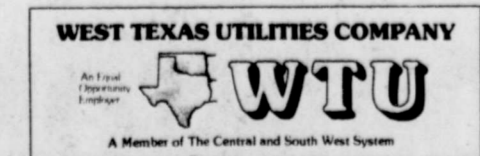

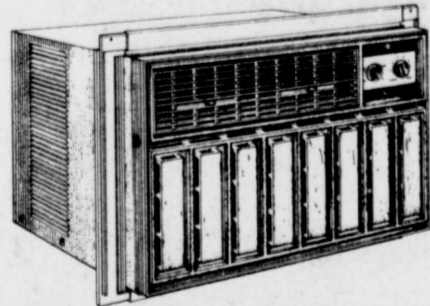

Starting some two years ago, we began a health education approach to create an awareness within the adult population of the nature and consequences of hypertension and the necessity for an annual blood pressure check. Screening was begun in two pilot projects—in Public Health Region 7 in East Texas and in Laredo. Since then, with additional funding through a federal hypertension control effort, the Department has laid the foundation for a truly statewide program. All Regions are now involved in screening. Some 35 Local Health Departments are actively participating, and others have screening plans for the near future. Our goal is to have the program implemented in all Local Health Departments. Further, we have a cooperative effort with the Texas Affiliate of the American Heart Association to increase its on-going hypertension

In keeping with emphasis on dietary management of hypertensives, a nutrition counseling component has been initiated whereby our public health nurses provide nutrition counseling and printed diet instructions up-

on request by the physician managing a patient.

All screening data is put on computer tapes which permit on-going program evaluation. This will allow us to focus screening efforts on selected target groups.
