Stemming from a very modest beginning of 50 miles of line bringing service to 128 service connections in 1938, the Deaf Smith Country Electric Cooperative, Inc. has evolved into a 1539 miles electric system bringing electric service to 2219 service connections in 1950, affecting the mode of living and the methods, household practices, etc. enabled by its expansion.

cleared up and spread on our books by REA auditors.
