## Strange Malady Claims Life Of Nazareth Child

Richard Guggemos, 4-year old son of Mrs. J. B. Guggemos of Nazareth, died Wednesday morning in Dimmitt after a few days illness. The boy was a victim of a rare disease which defies the red blood corpuscles, for which medical science has found no cure. The Guggemos family resides north of Nazareth. The boy's father, J. B. Guggemos was killed in an automobile-train wreck at Tulia about three years ago. Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon. Interment was in the Nazareth cemetery. The boy is survived by his mother and a number of brothers and sisters.

## Committee in Session Prepare Primary Ballot

The Castro County Democratic Executive Committee met Monday night of this week and prepared the official ballot for the printer. A number of candidates who had filed, withdrew their names Monday. Jess Mitchell of Muleshoe withdrew from the race for representative. In the county races the announcement of most interest was the withdrawal of A. D. Ray from the Sheriff's race. Ray Cowser will be unopposed for County Attorney, both Harold Locke and Clyde Shuford withdrawing. Sylvester Birkenfeld will also be unopposed for Constable of precinct No. 1. No one has filed as a candidate for Justice of the Peace in any of the Precincts.

## Farmers Can Only Get \$250 Loan for Wheat

Government wheat loans to farmers in Castro county will be limited to \$250 to the individual, it was learned this week. It had been thought that this would be raised to \$400 because of the drought area, but efforts to get the emergency limit were futile. The time limit on applying for these loans is July 15, and farmers are urged to get in the applications immediately. Mrs. M. ## Protests Low Cotton Allotment In This County

Castro county's quota of tax free cotton under the Bankhead bill was announced from Washington last week as 999 bales. At the same time the figures were announced it was stated that appeal from the figures could be taken within 15 days but that it was very doubtful if any appeal for an increase in the quota would be granted. However since it is felt by the people of the county that serious injustice has been done the county by the low allotment, a brief has been prepared by the County Agent and County Cotton Committee and forwarded to Washington by air mail. At the same time messages were sent to Congressman Marvin Jones by the Committee and by E. F. Harman of the local Chamber of Commerce requesting assistance in getting the county allotment increased. As matters now stand, it is estimated that only one bale in four that will be produced in the county can be sold tax-free. Final decision can be expected from Washington in a few days.

## ARNEY MAN DIES AFTER SHOOTING SELF

Emmett Tipton, 48, died in the Plainview Sanitarium Tuesday afternoon from a bullet wound said to have been self-inflicted. Tipton lived in the Arney neighborhood in northeast Castro county and was a farmer. The tragedy occurred Tuesday morning about 10:30 o'clock. Tipton had been in bad health for several months and is said to have been worried considerably about financial matters. A short time prior to shooting himself, members of the family prevented him carrying out a threat to hang himself. Tipton is said to have been alone in a bedroom when the shot was fired from a '22 rifle which resulted in his death. The bullet entered the right temple and emerged at the top of his head. His wife, 3 sons and one married daughter survive. In addition there are four surviving brothers. Dr. N. F. Grafton of Plainview will preach Friday evening of this week at the Presbyterian church. E. F. Harman suffered an attack of acute indigestion Tuesday afternoon and for a time was seriously ill. He was recovering nicely Thursday, however.

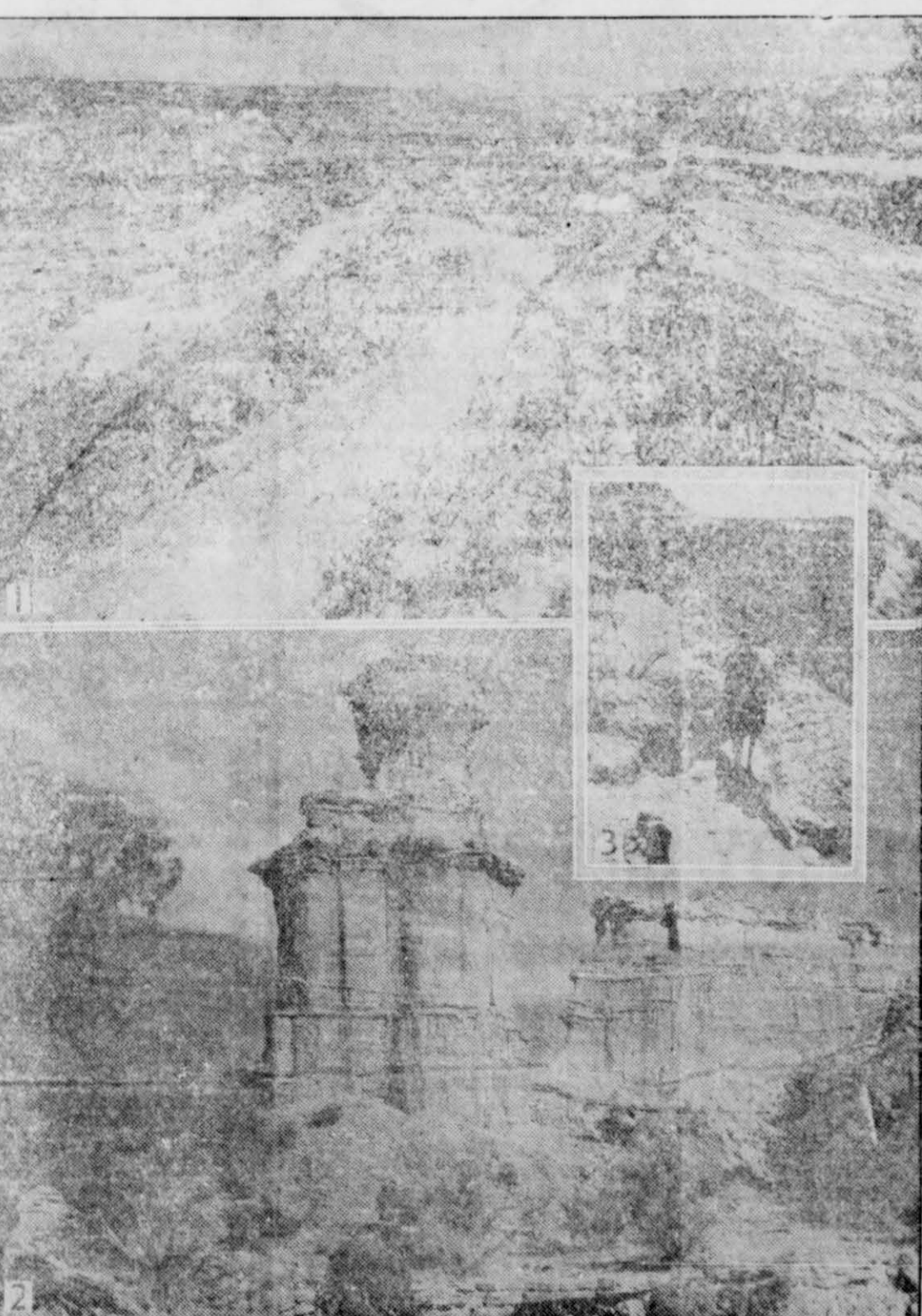
## Jess Mitchell Out of The Race For Representative

Jess Mitchell, newspaper editor at Muleshoe in Bailey county has withdrawn his name as a candidate for Representative from this 120th Legislative district, according to information received early this week by The Castro County News, the following statement being authorized for publication: "It is with considerable regret that I announce my withdrawal as a candidate for representative from this 120th Legislative district and I take this opportunity of thanking the citizens of this district for their very favorable response to my activities in this direction. "During the past week there have arisen unforeseen business complications of a personal nature, which demand my immediate attention, some of them requiring me to be out of the state for an indefinite period and which would handicap the prosecution of my candidacy, hence my decision to withdraw from the race. "I have very greatly enjoyed the privilege of traveling over this district, meeting the voters and discussing with them the needs of Texas in general and of this area in particular. The fact that I have already had assurances from citizens which virtually guarantee me an entry into the second Democratic primary makes retirement from the race more regrettable to me. I deeply appreciate the thousands of voters all over the district who have reposed their confidence in my ability in promising me their vote and shall ever feel indebted to the hundreds of people in this district who have wholeheartedly sponsored my candidacy.—JESS MITCHELL."

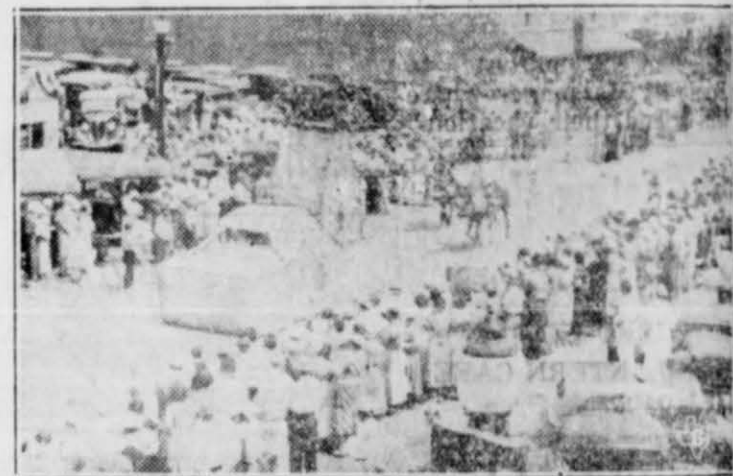
