## Bronte to establish Veterans Memorial

Dear Editor,

I am a fighter, so I've fought for many of my dreams to come true. But the biggest and most important one-for many rea-sons-is about to come true because many people are working
together toward the common goal logether toward the common goal
of building a veteran's war meor building a veteran's war me-
morial here in Bronte, my hometown.
For
For me, the dream started in 1991, when we commemorated the 50th anniversary of Pearl Harbor Day. The amount of memorabilia brought forth was over-
whelming. We filled upthe build ing set aside plus the sidewalk of a city block. There were displays of pictures, uniforms weapons, newspaper headlines and articles, letters, souvenirs, etc. Since most of the momentos were made of perishable materials it seemed imperative that at least the names of the veterans be set in stone WWII are still around. In the WWII are still around. In the
years since then no one has come years since then no one has come
forward to shoulder the responsibility for doing this, so somen interested friends and myself got
together and formed a committee together and formed a committee
to get the job done. to get the job done.
I'm not what you would call a history buff but I have a vivid
memory of the 1941-1945 era. We collected scrap victory gardens, took our pennies, nickels, and dimes to school to buy war bonds, and suffered the rationing of sugar, meat, shoes, tires, gasoline, etc. It was an adventure for us kids when my dad and mom packed up and went to the coast to work in the war plants.
My dad was a trucker so he built a My dad was a trucker so he built a
home on the back of a flatbed home on the back of a flatbed
truck. All the aunts helped to can meat from a calf and many homegrown vegetables to take on the
stamps for saved enough ration stamps for gasoline and took off
with the whole family - five kids, ne a babe-in-arms. Since 1991 I have looked at many war memorials around the country. I got cold chills when I perused the beautiful stones and
thought about what they represent. My husband was in WWII almost from the beginning. His memories are so horrible he won't talk about them. My cousin, J.W. Athey, was missing in action for a long time. He wouldn't talk about that either. History has attempted
to record those events. All we can do is make sure that all our veterans are remembered for their gallant acts of patriotism.
We plan to put the memorial by the flagpole near the old Bronte depot where most of the men and women embarked on their jour neys to serve their country all over the world. It will encompass clude names from Coke will include names from Coke county though we have no big towns, many people are excited about what we are doing. Responses are pouring in, but we don't want even one name to be left off our list. This letter is a plea for help.
