Pest Management News

GENERAL SITUATION - they feed on seedling plant roots

Temperatures have warmed up reducing plant stand and vigor. changed dramatically in the past two weeks (last week of April and
first week of May) first week of May). It's amazing turned to Concho Valley. Wheat is in a moistur right now. Armyworms and cutworms are moving out of pastures and into wheat, sorghum, and haygrazer fields by the thousands. In some areas, the ground is liter-
ally crawling alive with ally crawling alive with worms.
Most of the wheat is in the milk Most of the wheat is in the milk
to a soft dough stage. a soft dough stage.
ARMY WORMS
worms continue to be a problemthroughout the area.
Producers are encouraged to
continue inspection of continue inspection of wheat, sor-
ghum, and haygrazer fields for ghum, and haygrazer fields for
armyworms and their damage. During the last week of April, armyworm numbers ranged from 3
to 22 per square foot to 22 per square foot. The highest numbers are usually found in
close proximity to pastures or close proximity to pastures or
wheat fields with high plant density and still lush green.
Will sorghum and haygrazer
come back if the leaf area is removed above ground? The growing point is still below the soil
surface. Much of the leaf can be removed without killing the plant.
However, growing However, growing conditions
need to be favorable and sorghum need to be favorable and sorghum
is usually always slow to recover even when conditions are good.
So monitor your stands carefully. You may get by just spraying the field margins.
WIRE WORMS
WIREWORMS \& CUT-
WORMS-With WORMS-With the excellent crop of weeds this spring, comes
wireworms and cutworms which could be a problem at planting
$\qquad$ False wireworms have already
been a problem in some sorghum fields, and producers that are practicing minimum-tillage or no-
till should consider a seed or planter box treatment to control
wireworms. Wireworms wireworms. Wireworms feed on
planted sorghum seedpreventing planted sorghum seedpreventing
germination. To a lesser degree,

Cutworms can cause producers to lose 5 to 50 percent of their stand. The cutworm species that seems to be causing the most problem in this region is the variegated cutworm that exhibits
both climbing and army-type beboth climbing and army-type be-
havior.

## Climbing cutworms climb the

 stems of herbaceous plants, vines, and shrubs and eat buds, leaves, and fruit. The army-type behavior is best described as cutworms that occur in great numbers, and after consuming all the vegetation in one area, crawl along theground by the thousands to new ground by the
vegetation.
The complete life cycle of the variegated cutworm from egg, lar-
vae, pup to adult varies from 40 48 dap to adult varies from $40-$ days. The females lay their eggs in bare patches of 60 or more on stems or leaves of low plants, on twigs or branches of trees, on fences and buildings. Up to
2,000 eggs can be laid by a singl 2,000 eggs can be laid by a single They may feed for $3-4$ weeks before they reach maturity.
