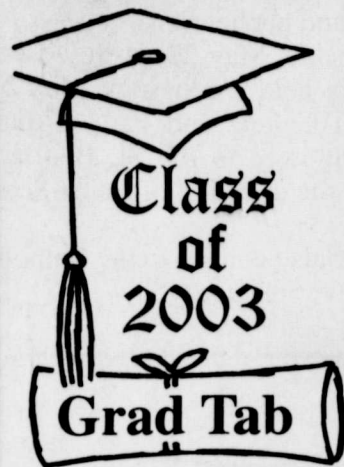

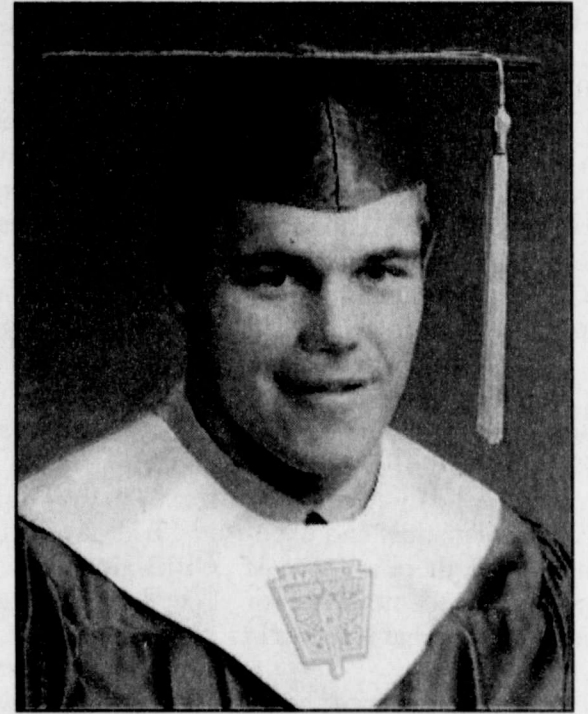


**Leslye Ann Geistmann**

### Winters swimming pool opens Tuesday, May 27

Troylene Lincycomb, manager of the Winters city swimming pool, announces the opening of the pool on Tuesday, May 27.

### Commissioners close portion of County Road 296, accept Ballinger National Bank depository bid

Commissioner Precinct 4 Ricky Strube made a decision he's hardly, if ever, done before at Tuesday's special meeting of Commissioners Court.

Eight citizens had filed a petition to close the portion of County Road 296 between FM 2111 and County Road 311. Represented by attorney Ebb Grindstaff, two of the petitioners were present to state their case for closing the road which

is near the old Ballinger Lake.

Matt Sexton said he was "just tired of picking up the trash dumped on the short 'lane.'" Mrs. Roy Baker said the dumping was a problem and had become a greater problem since the lake is dry.

Grindstaff told the court there is an alternate route to the old lake which would add a mile and a half travel to get to the lake. Grindstaff said he had

found no records of dedication of the road to the county.

Commissioner Strube said Bill Lange was present and in opposition to the road closing. Lange told the court he was opposed to the closing because he owned land across the old lake and used the road to get to his place.

Strube said he had never closed a county road if there

# Editorial

## Oil Bidness

We continue to pursue the topic of coal bed methane (CBM), and, this time, we are going to cover how CBM is assessed and just how important it might be in the next decade or so.

Last time, we introduced the basics of CBM and talked about where it occurs. We also discussed the methods used to produce CBM, including the key idea of removing water from the coal to allow the methane to escape into a sales line.

But, how does someone estimate the amount of methane that is in a coal seam? This is important because an operator has to determine the economic viability of a project in pursuit of CBM. Without some idea of what is there to recover, it would just be a shot in the dark.

Estimating hydrocarbon reserves in any form is less than straightforward. For CBM, it involves a good mixture of science, mathematics, and experience. And, there are at least two often-used methods for estimating methane volumes in coal.

One, considered more accurate, involves drilling a core in the top of a coal seam. The core is extracted in a pressurized container (not allowing methane to escape prior to retrieval) and the amount of methane that escapes in a lab is measured. This ratio of free methane to the volume of coal is utilized to estimate the volume of methane in place. This ratio can be applied to known volumes of coal (from logs and other measurements) to ascertain the amount of methane to expect for recovery.

While this method is usually an accurate way of estimating recoverable methane, it has at least two drawbacks. It is expensive and sometimes it is just not possible to drill enough cores to properly represent a large area of varying methane yield.

Another method involves more estimation than measurement, but it has shown to be more representative over large

areas. The average yield of methane per ton of coal can be estimated based on analogous production and recovery in other coal seams. Adjustments are made for coal quality, depth, etc., until a representative yield is calculated. This yield is typically greater than 50 cubic feet per ton of coal for successful projects.

O.K., now that we understand how the amount of methane might be estimated, how big might CBM be in the United States?

There is about 175 trillion cubic feet of natural gas reserves in the lower 48 states. About 10 percent is produced and consumed every year. The CBM in place in the Rocky Mountains is about 184 trillion cubic feet, but only about 50 trillion cubic feet is economically recoverable.

Based on these volumes, about 30 percent of the gas reserves in the United States are in CBM. And, there is enough CBM already discovered and slated for production to provide all of the U.S. gas consumption for about 3 years.

No matter how you look at it, that means CBM is a significant resource and a strategic asset in an ever-increasing consumption market for natural gas. No wonder so many operators are searching for, producing, and selling methane from coal seams.

As long as the market signals that natural gas and its component methane is a valuable asset, operators will go the extra mile for what "seams" like a good source of revenue. (Sorry, I couldn't resist!)

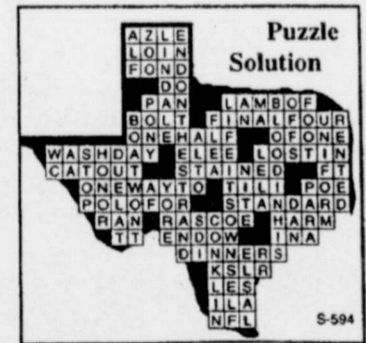
Dessie Jernagan, my grandmother, I love you, and last, but not least, Jean Boles, who in her duty as editor, has put my name in print more times that I care to admit.

### Excerpts from the graduation speech no one heard

Here it is another May, another graduation. Last year I was thrilled to have been asked to speak to the graduating seniors of Winters High School. You might remember, a tremendous hail storm struck right about the time I began to speak. Now, I do not give up easily, so the following is a distilled version of that speech. (Watch out for more storms, *Winters Enterprise*).

*To our beloved seniors, I am, I hope you know, a Christian. However, there are some things I would tell you were I an atheist. Among those —*

He stated, furthermore, that women who offer their sexual love for free lose all their bargaining power. George Gilder, the Harvard-educated sociologist, contends that sexual liberation liberates men — even a "lady of the evening" charges. (There's a saying that) Grandpa put it like this: why pay for the cow if you can get the milk for free?*

- *Men, if your desire is to accumulate possessions (if there is no world to come, why not accumulate all you can?), guard your sexuality. 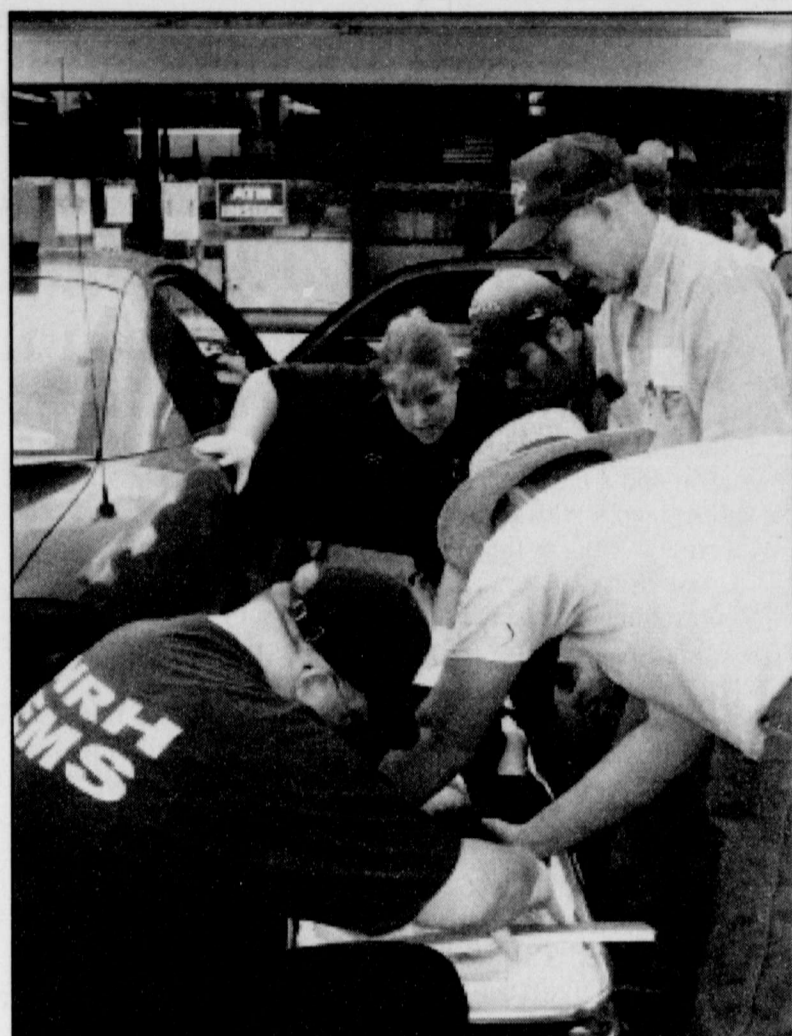
specialized care to the most seriously ill or injured. Texans benefit daily from the knowledge and skills of 50,000 trained and certified emergency personnel.

## Home defensive driving course now available at Winters Public Library

Residents of Winters who like to drive fast now have another reason to visit the Winters Public Library at 120 N. Main.

U.S. Interactive, the company that makes "Take Home Defensive Driving" on videotape and DVD, has donated

several copies of both versions of the course for checkout at the library.

U.S. Interactive pioneered the home-based driving safety course industry in 1994. Its driving safety course is widely available in video and grocery stores in several states. By

placing the course in the library, residents of Winters and neighboring communities in the area served by the Winters Public Library will have access to the same home-based, state-certified driving safety course.

Drivers use the Internet or phone to register, pay for the course and take the required test at their own pace and in the comfort of their home or office.

"By placing our course in public libraries, we are helping make them accessible to rural populations and lower-income drivers who have been underserved in the past," said Michael Curran, executive vice-president of U.S. Interactive.

The benefit of the course are twofold: insurance premium reduction and traffic ticket dismissal.

"All drivers who complete the course are eligible to reduce their annual insurance premiums 10 percent for three years," said Curran. "The best part is that you don't have to wait until you get a ticket to start saving money on your insurance. If you take the course now and get a ticket later, you'll still have the option to take the course again to dismiss your ticket. But you are only allowed to dismiss one ticket per calendar year by taking a driving safety course."

U.S. Interactive has provided the library with videotape and DVD copies of the course. Patrons will be able to check out the course with their library cards, subject to the library's existing policy.

## PROPERTY VALUE PROTEST AND APPEAL PROCEDURES

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- \* Market or special appraised value placed on your property
- \* Appraisal exceeds median level of appraisal of comparable properties
- \* Inclusion of your property on the appraisal roll
- \* Any exemptions that may apply to you
- \* Qualifications for an agricultural appraisal
- \* Taxable status of your property
- \* Local governments which should be taxing your property
- \* Ownership of property
- \* Change of use of land receiving special appraisal
- \* Any action that applies to and adversely affects you

### INFORMAL REVIEW

Upon receipt of your appraisal notice, please review the VALUE of the property in relation to what like property would sell for THIS YEAR. If you have questions or disagree with that VALUE, PLEASE CALL or COME BY the Appraisal District, 406 Hutchings Avenue, Ballinger, 325-365-3583 PRIOR to filing the Protest Form. If you still decide it is necessary to appear before the ARB (Appraisal Review Board) fill in, sign, and return the protest form by the deadline stated on the notice.

### REVIEW BY THE APPRAISAL REVIEW BOARD

If you can't resolve your problem, informally with the county appraisal district (CAD) staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with the appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a WRITTEN request for an ARB hearing (called a Notice of Protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date, and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening, Saturday, or Sunday. There will be ONE weekend day available for appointments. You should make this request at the time you file your protest. Prior to your hearing you may ask to review the evidence the CAD will use to uphold their determination. The CAD may ask you for a copy of the evidence you plan to present. The hearing will be INFORMAL. You or a designated agent may appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The CAD representative will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the CAD representative. **The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented.**

You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 406 Hutchings Avenue, Ballinger, or one is provided with your appraisal notice.

NOTE: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case with you or the CAD prior to the hearing.

### REVIEW BY DISTRICT COURT

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

### TAX PAYMENT

If you appeal and your case is pending, you must pay the lesser of the amount of taxes due on the portion of the taxable value not in dispute or the amount of taxes due on the property under the order from which the appeal is taken.

### MORE INFORMATION

You can get more information by contacting your appraisal district office at Runnels County Appraisal District, 406 Hutchings Avenue, P.O. Box 524, Ballinger, TX 76821 or 325-365-3583. You can also get a pamphlet describing how to prepare a protest from the appraisal district or from the State Comptroller's Property Tax Division at P.O. Box 13528, Austin, TX 78711.

### RECEIVING NOTICE

The law requires mailing an appraisal notice under certain circumstances: ownership change, value change, exemption change, etc. **Therefore, not everyone received a notice.** If your value didn't change or increase over \$1,000 in value, you did not receive notice. If you did not receive a notice but would like to verify your value or if you are concerned about anything regarding your account, please call the Appraisal District office and someone will be happy to help you and review your property information. Generally, if you did not receive notice, most likely nothing changed regarding your value or exemptions.

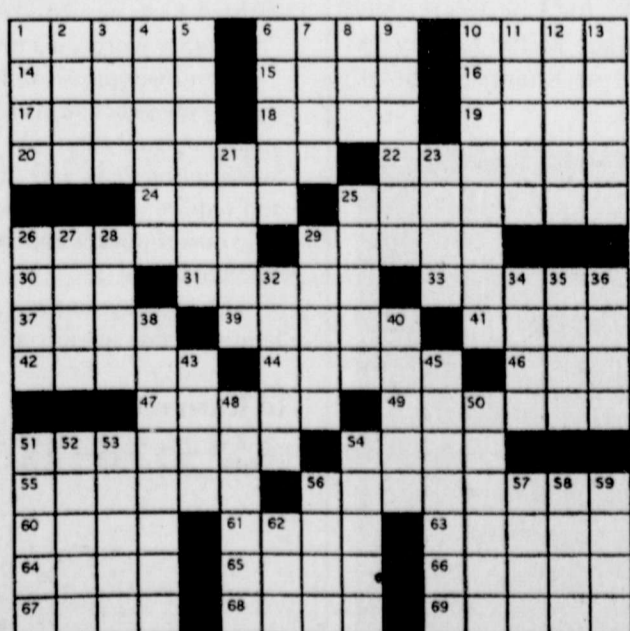

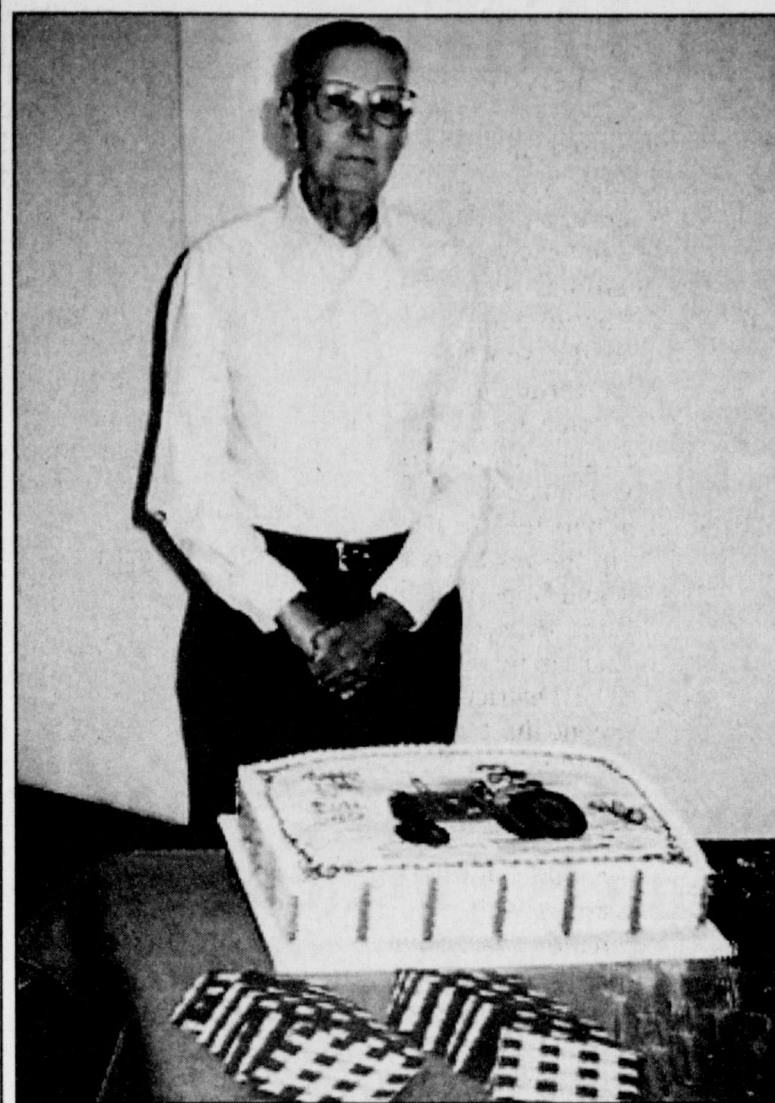

## L-KWCD establishes moratorium on drilling

The Board of Directors of the Lipan-Kickapoo Water Conservation District on Monday, May 12, 2003, adopted two resolutions pertaining to groundwater resources in the District. Due to the continuing drought and below normal recharge to the aquifers in the area, the Board adopted a resolution that puts a moratorium on the drilling of non-exempt wells and prohibits the issuance of drilling permits for either new or replacement non-exempt wells for a period of six months. Residents will still be allowed to drill domestic or livestock wells which are exempt from permitting under Texas Water Law.

Non-exempt wells are wells that can produce more than 25,000 (17.4 gpm) gallons per day and are generally high im-

pact wells used for irrigation, industrial or water supply, or municipal water supply. Exempt wells are generally those used for domestic and livestock use and which cannot physically produce more than 25,000 gallons per day. Wells used to supply water for a platted subdivision are not exempt.

"The board has been wrestling with how to address the drought and the shortage of groundwater throughout the District for some time," said Allan Lange, general manager, of the Lipan-Kickapoo WCD. "Board members feel the need to try to help the residents of the District and hope that by limiting drilling, everyone will be able to share in this limited resource. The District is required to amend its ten year Management Plan and Rules

later this summer and hopefully this resolution will give us a little breathing room until it starts raining," Lange said.

The Board also adopted a resolution to promote conservation. In this resolution, the board urges all residents of the District to limit all outdoor use of water as much as practicable and to water landscapes at night, with calm winds and not more than once a week. It also urges all farmers to limit irrigation as much as practicable during this drought crisis in order to maintain the water levels in the aquifers.

The Water District covers Runnels County and most of Concho and Tom Green counties. Approximately 2.25 million acres or 3,535 square miles are affected by these resolutions.

was opposition to it and was hesitant to do it this time. Sexton commented to Strube that "eight people signed the petition to close and one has expressed opposition—don't you represent all the people?" Strube asked Lange about his opposition to the closing again and Lange said he would "go with whatever decision is made."

Strube then moved to close the road, with the motion seconded by Commissioner Precinct 3 Thurman Self. The order passed unanimously.

In other business, the bank depository bid was awarded to Ballinger National Bank, with subdepository contracts awarded to Citizens State Bank of Miles and Security State Bank of Wingate-Winters. Bids for the depositories were opened at last week's meeting,

but action was tabled for study.

Commissioner Self asked for an explanation from David Springer of Ballinger National Bank about rate of interest being paid at the "jumbo rate." Springer made an explanation that the bank would pay the "jumbo rate" on any amount the county placed in a certificate of deposit for 30 to 365 days at an indexed amount based on the jumbo rate.

Commissioner Strube commented he and County Treasurer Margarette Smith had figured the bids from both Ballinger National Bank and The First National Bank of Ballinger. "Based on April figures, the Ballinger National Bank bid would have paid the County \$311 more than The First National Bank bid.

Commissioners voted unanimously to accept the bid of

Ballinger National Bank as the County's depository.

Other agenda items and action taken included:

- Winters Independent School District Superintendent Danny Clack asked the Court to consider entering into an agreement with the Winters, Ballinger, and Miles School Districts for the purchase and use of a drug dog. Clack indicated each of the districts spends about \$2,000 per school year for drug dogs and by the purchase of a dog and training at a cost of roughly \$9,000, would save taxpayers money. "All I'm asking is your consideration of this when you begin budget talks," Clack said.
- Elizabeth O'Connor reported on the Runnels County Jail House Museum and Fine Arts Center, Inc. She said Texas Tech University is to assist in drawing up plans for the remodeling. "We're making some progress, although slowly," she said.

- Commissioners voted to change the voting location for Election Precinct 1 from the Courthouse to the Runnels County Annex Building and submitting a letter for pre-clearance to the Department of Justice.

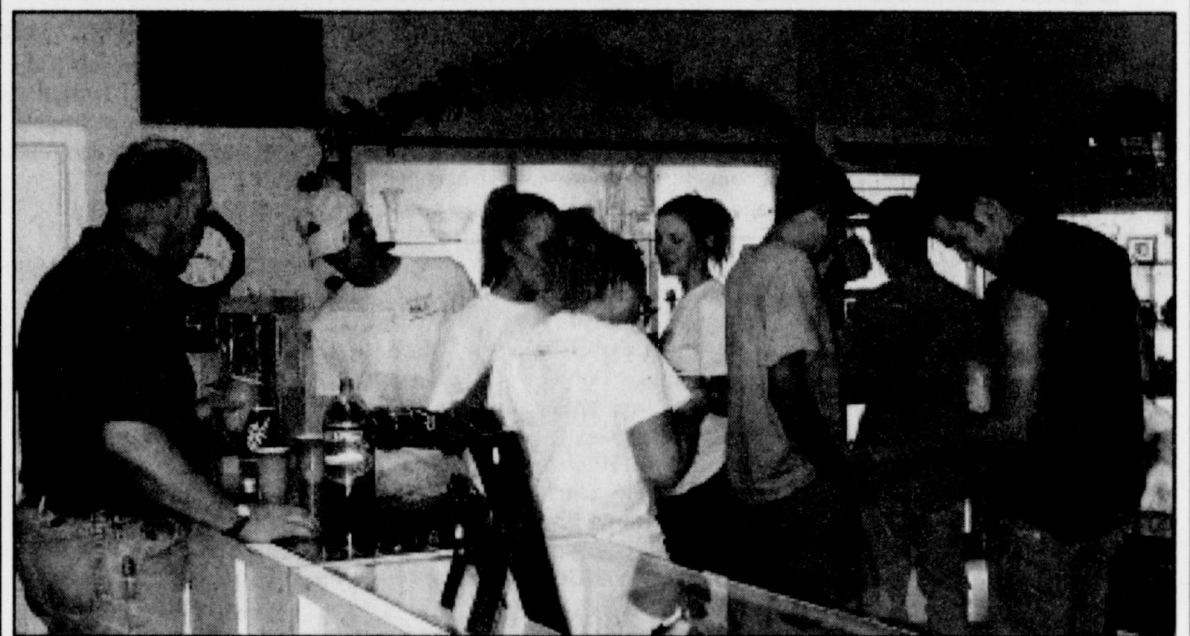
Commissioners recessed, then began a budget workshop for the next fiscal year.

## DPS reminds drivers to be safe over Memorial Day weekend

DPS is reminding drivers to remember three steps to roadway safety during the Memorial Day weekend - don't speed; don't drink and drive, and always wear a seat belt. Following these simple steps will increase the safety of Texans, traveling during this busy holiday weekend. "We want to encourage all drivers to take responsibility for their own safety and that of their passengers," said Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr., director of the DPS. "Remember to designate a sober driver, and make sure that everyone in the vehicle is wearing a

seat belt or buckled into the appropriate child safety seat." DPS troopers and many other police agencies are increasing patrols over the weekend to stop drunk drivers, speeders and seat belt violators. Through a statewide campaign, Click It or Ticket, DPS and the Texas Department of Transportation are urging motorists to buckle up or face a fine. Other police agencies throughout Texas are also focusing their efforts on enforcing the state's occupant protection laws for adults and chil-

dren. Another nationwide effort designed to reduce fatalities is the C.A.R.E. - Combined Accident Reduction Effort - program. State police across the nation participate in C.A.R.E., maximizing enforcement on major interstate highways to reduce fatalities commonly associated with holiday weekends. Statistically, the deadliest time on the road during Memorial Day weekend is between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m.-a time frame when alcohol and fatigue often are cited as factors.

## Governor Rick Perry declares May Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Month

Governor Rick Perry has declared May as Motorcycle Safety and Awareness Month in Texas. DPS urges all motorcyclists, both experienced and inexperienced, to attend a professionally taught motorcycle course to improve their skills and increase safety. More than 700,000 people in Texas are licensed to operate a motorcycle - and as the weather improves during the month of May, many of these drivers take to the roadways to enjoy the season. For both new and experienced riders, May is the perfect time to renew motorcycle operation skills and knowledge. "The DPS Motorcycle Safety Unit offers basic and advanced motorcycle operator training in 45 permanent locations and 11 other sites that use two mobile training units," said Clifton Burdette, coordinator of the DPS Motorcycle Safety Unit. "Last year, 20,636 Texans took either the basic or ad-

vanced course - a 29 percent increase over 2001." The basic motorcycle operator training course is for unlicensed or inexperienced riders, and the advanced course is for more experienced riders. In addition, both of the courses may qualify for ticket dismissal and insurance discounts. While Texas does not require all motorcycle riders to wear helmets, the DPS strongly encourages riders to wear helmets to increase safety and save lives. Fatalities of motorcyclists not wearing helmets drastically increased during the last decade. In 1990, 21 percent of motorcycle-related fatalities involved people not

wearing helmets. By 2000, that number had increased to 63 percent. Texas law states that in order to be exempt from wearing a helmet, a person must be at least 21 years of age. In addition, they must successfully complete a motorcycle safety course or be covered by a health insurance plan providing at least \$10,000 in medical benefits for motorcycle-related injuries. ## Progressive Farmer Safety Day Camp set for Wednesday, June 4, at Angelo State

Parents with active youngsters should sign them up today for the biennial *Progressive Farmer* Farm Safety Day Camp set for June 4 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at Angelo State University's Management, Instruction, and Research (MIR) Center.

The event is sponsored by Texas Cooperative Extension in partnership with *Progressive Farmer* magazine. Because of the hands-on nature of the camp, space is limited to 125 youth, so pre-registration no later than May 28 is manda-

tory. Campers should be third graders and up. Those entering third grade in the fall are eligible.

The MIR Center is located on Grape Creek Road.

Brandon Asbill, Tom Green County's Extension 4-H and youth development agent and the safety camp's chairman, said too often safety is dismissed until an injury occurs. He said that many times these "accidents" can be prevented with a bit of forethought and safety training.

"Our whole aim here is to arm children with the basic

safety information they need to recognize and react positively in a dangerous situation," said Asbill.

"Though this event has the word 'farm' in its title, the information provided is actually applicable to any youth, urban or rural, who is active outdoors. We'll address everything from lawnmower precautions to firearm safety. There are no other youth safety programs available in our part of the state that offers the assortment of safety topics we do. The day will be fast-moving, fun, and packed with plenty of action."

After the morning registration, campers will be divided into small groups which will rotate through eight safety sessions. There will be breaks for snacks, lunch, prizes, a t-shirt for each camper, and lots of valuable information on how to remain safe on the farm and at home.

Besides firearm safety and lawn equipment safety, chemical safety, and wildlife information will be addressed along with small equipment tips, tractor power takeoff (PTO) safety, fire safety, and weather information.

The pre-registration fee is \$10 per child or \$20 flat fee for families with two or more children attending. Parents are encouraged to attend the opening and closing general sessions.

## Texas Farmers Union president supports COOL law during USDA hearing

During a U.S. Department of Agriculture hearing in Austin, Texas Farmers Union President Wes Sims outlined consumer and producer benefits of a mandatory country-of-origin food labeling law.

Sims, who operates a diversified family farm in Sweetwater, called the country-of-origin labeling (COOL) law "one of the most important efforts to ensure the survivability and to enhance economic opportunities for U.S., independent livestock and produce farmers."

In both oral and written comments to USDA officials, Sims asserted that the COOL law included in the 2002 farm bill will benefit independent farmers and ranchers.

"Country-of-origin labeling provides U.S. producers, as well as those from other countries, with a mechanism that allows for product differentiation in the marketplace," he said. "This is really no different than the retail product differentiation sought by processors and retailers when they label or brand products as a means to gain acceptance and loyalty and increase their share of the market."

Sims said he took exception to claims that the new law would excessively burden producers. "As an independent Texas agriculture producer, I am offended by the scare tactics that large agribusinesses are using to deter farmers and ranchers from supporting this beneficial law," he said. "Many producers have received threats of third-party

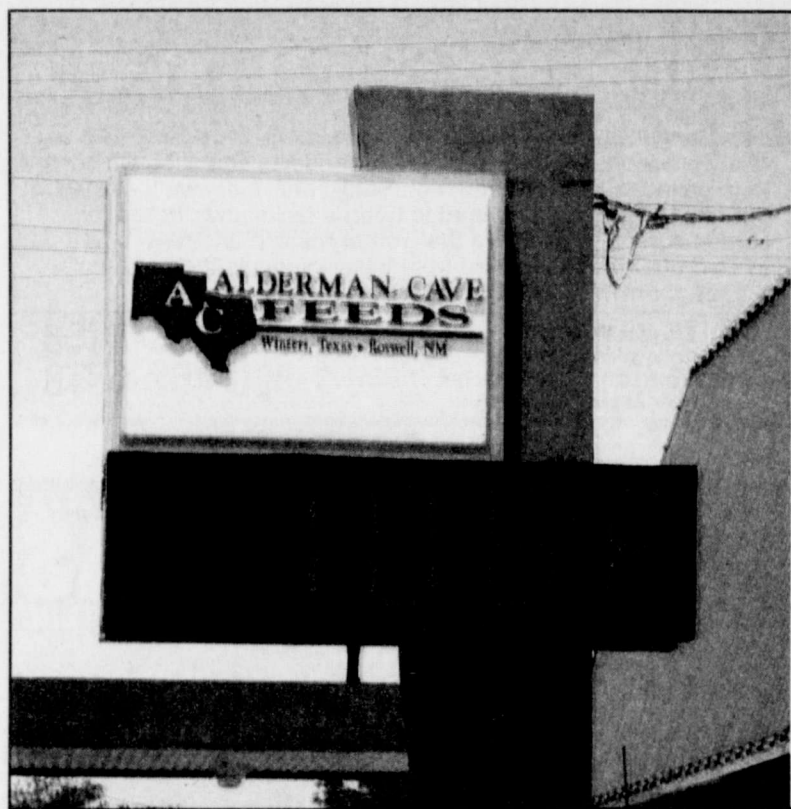
verification from meatpackers. There is nothing in the country-of-origin labeling law that requires third-party verification or burdensome audit trails."

While the debate over the merits of the law continues, USDA's Agriculture Marketing Service is holding a series of listening sessions across the country, like the one in Austin, to gather comments about the mandatory country-of-origin labeling rules, which will go into effect by September 2004.

The Texas Farmers Union leader encouraged farmers and ranchers to unite in support of

the law to ensure it is implemented with the true intent of the law.

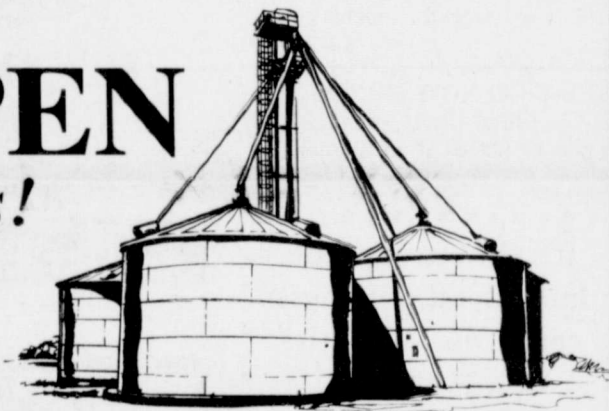
"We should all be focused on the development of the rules and regulations to allow for the law's implementation in the most efficient and least burdensome manner possible," he said. "Farmers Union will continue to work with USDA to make sure COOL is implemented in a way that provides accurate and appropriate information to consumers while minimizing the cost and potential liability for producers, processors and retailers."
