Our text is as follows and is taken from the acholarly pro ement of Dr．W．T．Rouse of Wuco，Texas：
＂I have often thought of the possibility of a charoh of Jesus Christ becoming a Synagogue of Satan．Can longer has a right to be called a church of Jeom Christ？Withoutquestion a church may so depart from the scriptural pattern that it has no right to fay claim to the right to be considered a church after the Gospel order

He uses Bible language．But，it means this：
It can so depart from truth and right that it will become＂ise metting house of the devil．＂The synagogue，youknow，is a place where the Jews meet and worship．So，Dr．Rouse says that an organization，though once a church of Jesus Christafter the scriptuial pattern，may beome the house of the devil．Rather se－ vere，eh？But candidly，don＇t you think the ehurch＇s hy pocrisy
at claiming to be a Baptist church，after it had abaudoned Baptist teachings on the question of baptism and the Lord＇s Supper，de serves，even，more severe critioism than simply to be branded as
＂the house of the devil？＂brand them as＂the bouse of the devil＇，fo
Dr．Rouse does not brand them as＂the bouse of the devil＇for
arning against Baptist teachings and practices－that＇s their right，but he feels outraged at their unmitigated deception and de ceit and spirit of downright unfairness in claiming still to be a Baptist church．If they bad risen up and said that they no longe
believed in those things and hence were no longer Baptists，it would be altogether a different－thing and no man would bave a right to denounce them．But to claim to be a thing and then vio－ late the very thing they claim they are，is a deceit and fraud on its face and a hypocrisy the stench of which is enough to nauseate Almighty God

## Dr．Rouse＇s Question．

Why？
Because it so far departed from the truth and right，that Christ refuses by the declarations of Bis Word，to be the Head o such an or ganization．

Thereare two things through which a regular New Testa loses its identity as sueh and through which it forfeits its right to be called a Baptist annrch．
1．When a church，like the Park Avenue，violates its teach Baptist church．One of the former pastora of this very church eventually became a Uuitarian and denied the divinity of Christ and rejected the trinity of the Godhead．But，he as an individua bas as much right to expect to be recognized as a Baptist church．He would be guilty of no more deceit and hypocrisy than is any church that is guilty of violating its own teachings as the Parin Avenue church has done．

The ver moment it abolishes mitted by "machine" rule, it is not a church of the Lord Jesu Christ, but, according to Dr, Rouse, "it is a house of the devil," and when it is called a Baptist church, it is misnamed.

Let us enlarge on this that the cruth of our position may b fully understood. Let us make the following supposition:
A local Methodist congregation has in it a rich steward. H is dictatorial. There is a preacher aiso a member of the congrega due to political differences, or otherwise, and the rich steward tells the preacher that he is roing to the church and have him excluded without charges against him, and that he will not even give the preacher a hearing; the steward has influence sufficient to create chureh "machine," and take charge of the congregation and its church affairs. He carries out his threat, calls the congregation atua business session, and without the presiding elder or the pastor in charge, they have a business session, and proceed to ex ut regard to the governing power of the Methodist church What do you think of a Methodist like that? And what do you think the governing power of the Methodist church would do fo that rich steward and for the coterie that formed themselves int chureh "macnine" for the purpose of crucifying the preacher in question? To make a long story short, the Methodist church as governing body would rebuke the rich steward and his "machine," and demand of them to proceed according to the laws of the gov arnment of their church. And if they didn't do it, the place know as the Methodist church would be abandoned, the doors locked it until there could be gotten together a groupon men and women sufficient to constitute a congregation, and carry on the work o the Methodist church under its rules and regulations. Andi such group of men and women could not be found, in due time here would be a Misthodist meeting house for sale.

Very well, the above supposed case is clear and all agree tha it suoh a violation of Methodist church government should be Methodists. All of us feel like calling them a bunch of anarchist -which would be correct.

But, now, turl to the Baptist denomination. They have a system of government iust as binding, (and i! possible more bind ing uponits menbers as to their being bound by their honor, to be true to the churcu's government, for they ciaim only the New
Testament as their "Rule of Haith and Practice,") as any other Testament as their "Rule of taith and Practice,"") as any other

Hence, Baptists can do nothing except to declare to the wo that such infany is a travesty on Baptist principles and that al erpetrator as an enemy of real haptist principles And when such occasion arises, and other churches and indi vidaal Baptists, do not condemn such infamy, as Dr. Rouse has done, thay become equally goilty with the perpetrators of the in atrage he has committed. Hence they become a part of "the house of the devi
In oonclusion, don't misquote, or isisinterpret or misrepre
eent Dr. Rouse in his position. While he says that a church "o apostatize that it will become t.e Synagogue of Satan," "the house of the devil," he does not say that $\epsilon$ very member of such a church necessarily is bound for hell. For in the instance that Dr. Rouse refers to, the Park Avenue, accordirg to press reports, there were seventeen members that protested. Those who say that such procedure as $\mathrm{Dr}_{\mathrm{r}}$ arrel mentioned on tha part of the church of which he wrote, is correct and right and in keeping with the teachings of the New estament Scriptures and that Christ sets His sanction on such nfair and unjust and unholy procedure as that Dr. Jarrel men erted that they call night day and light darkness-they call right rong and wrong right. If the Bible is true, how can there be any salvation for one with such perversion of mind and beart tha one can believe such to be in keeping with the spirit of the Lord Jesus Ohrist!

It is evident that Dr. Rouse doesn't mean that every member of the Park Avenue church belongs to the devil. But, he does of hell rather than an evangel of the holy and penceful teachings of the Saviour. And he makes that awful charge against them ot because they have changed their view points on the doctrines involved, but because of their hypocrisy in saying that the new position they have taken is Baptistic.

Two chief difficuities harassed the Orient management during recoivorahip does not provide sufficient local traffe to meet costs of operation. Our old box eara are being completely rebuilt in our shops at Wichita, Kansas, and 500 cars (new) are to be bought to augment this supply. Five large freight
locomotives are under construction for delivery by early fall. The road locomotives is being re tied and a ditching machine has been purchased for ues in improving the right-of-way. We feel the Orient is now able to offer a service comparable to any other western road.

The policy of the new company will be to maintain the $\mathbf{e 0}$ operation of our datrons by giving the best service our resources will permit. We hope to maintain the cordial relationship that always has existed between the Orient and its people. Our ehief aim is to serve our people well. Toward this end our program is directed.
