A telegram was received yesterday stating that the engineers to do the preleminary surveying are en route and will reach here today. Hence, according to that information, they will be on the ground and ready for work by the time our readers receive their Enterprise this week.

That information indicates that there is no delay in the matter-that work will go right on.

The latter part of November the Winters Chamber of Commerce sent out questionaires to the 27 irrigation projects of Texas, asking for definite information, so that the leaders in the Coke-Runnels project would not attempt to lead the people blindly, but to be able to give definite information.
