best-protected, and the best-insured against exigencies of his return to civilian life.
Many people would like to
think of war merely as the arena for heroic conquest and victory. But that isn't all. Some
of those who go to war will not back disabled.
Yet it scems that ever-in creasing importance is being at tached to
ter and assictance for the disa-
bled. This Congress has been giving much thought to the substance, it probably will authorize a $\$ 300$ discharge allowance
for those coming home from for those coming home from
World War II. Already tens of thousands of men already ar eligible for this aid.

Another measure now under study in the Military Affair Committee would give the man month s furlough and a round trip ticket between his demobil ization center and his home. A

tering out.
When he is finally discharged his record will be complete and his status understood. Then h can look ahead. If he is in need if he must have outright disa bility compensation, such woul be ready or quickly available. Although vocational training for disabled veterans of this war already is available, the
