KIIE FIVING THROUGH THE CENTURIES

THE STORY BACK OF UCRA

| (Editor's Note-The following story was written by your editor in collaboration with Max Bentley, Manager of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce at Abilene, and editor of West Texas today, its official magazine. The story appeared in the January issue of West Texas Today, and we are reprinting it as a matter of interest to our readers). Last month, December 16th, the State Board of Water Engineers, at Austin announced grant of permit to the Upper Colorado River Authority for carrying out of the largest project pending in West Texas for flood control and irrigation one that had its start 35 years ago. Armed with the State Board's Authority and with assured Federal aid, the UCRA will set to work damming the Colorado River between Robert Lee and Bronte, in Coke County, and the three miles long dam will impound nearly 700,- 000 acre feet of water; enough to <br> irrigate 58,000 acres of land located in Coke, Runnels, Tom Green and Concho Counties. <br> The story of the great and now historic project, of the man who conceived it and some of those who have worked with him is told in the following article. - Max Bentley. <br> "It began 35 years ago," Bob Knierim of Bronte recalled the other day, "and now it looks like my dream of a big dam across the Colorado River near Bronte is coming true." <br> The 72 -year-old pioneer - for he has lived at Bronte for 41 of his years - spoke the full truth when he said "my dream."
