| Ausinn, Dec. 24.-A prograin designed to eliminate meompetent chiropractic practitioners in Texas was announced here this week by Dr. Walter H. Fischer of Temple, new president of the Texas State Chiropractie Association. <br> Dr. Fischer said his orgamization had been working on this program for several years and had hoped that legislation would be enacted to set up standards and a licensing board tor the profession and improve public health. <br> "A chiropractic licensing law would make our program unnecessary, but in the absence of such an act we feel justified in attempting to eliminate those practitioners who lack the educational background or the experience to be qualified chiropractors," Dr. Fischer said. <br> Dr. Fischer said the program had been designated the top project of the Association for 1948. The program will be continued, he said, until a licensing aet is adopted by the Legislature. Dr. Fischer said he understood a licensing bill would be introduced in the Legislature again in 1949. <br> "There are not a great number of incompetent or unethical practitioners," Dr. Fischer said.
