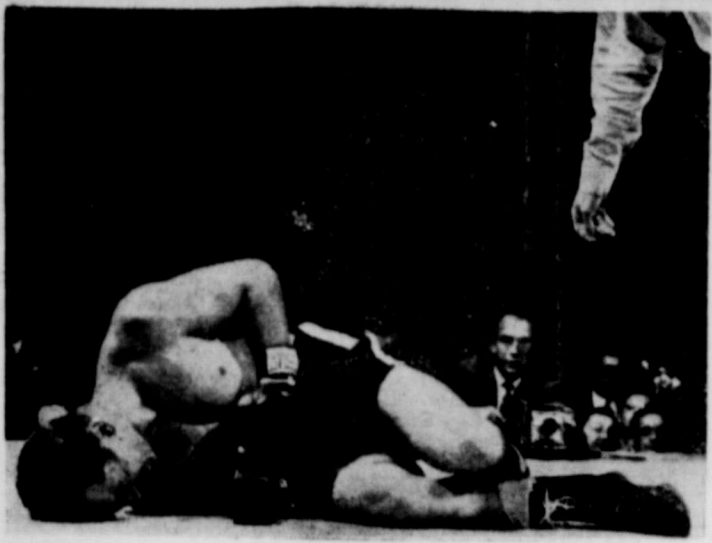

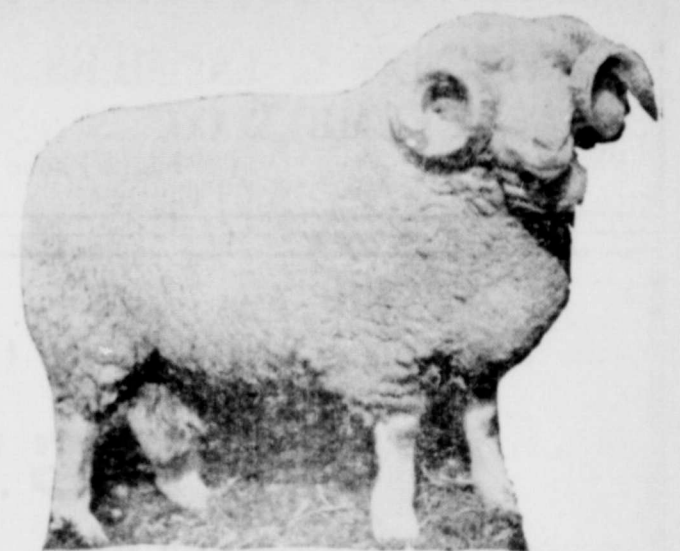

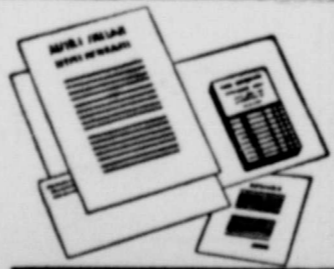
UNIT MOVES FORWARD—
