M. and 7:00 P. M. for the purpose of determining whether the governing body of the City of Bronte, Texas shall be authorized to make a water supply contract with the Upper Colorado River Authority, for the purpose of supplying water to the City of Bronte, Texas.

Only qualified electors of the City, who own taxable property therein and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be permitted to vote at such election.

A copy of the proposed water supply contract is on file at the office of the Mayor at the City Hall where it may be inspected by any interested person.

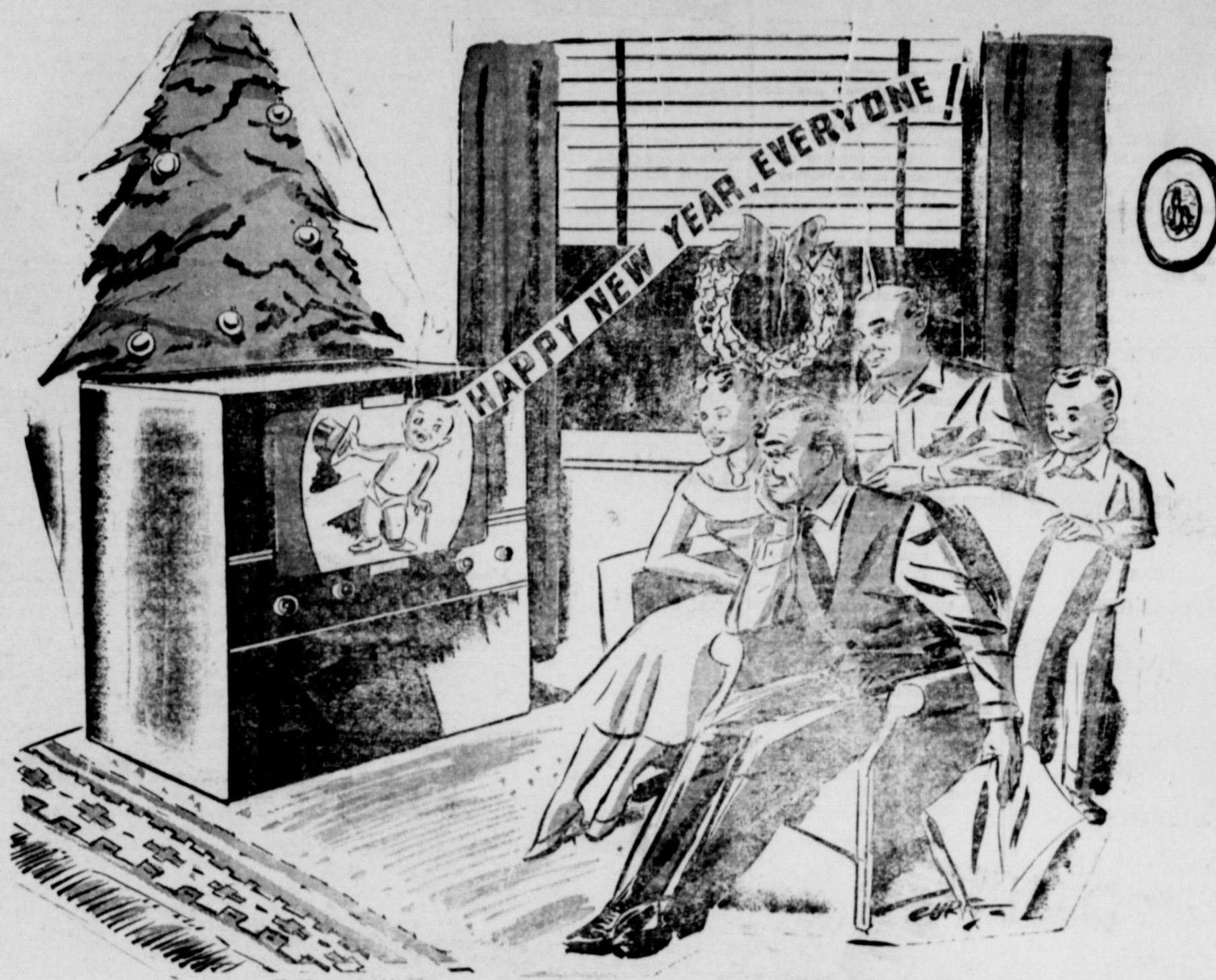
