## Polio Vaccine Available Here For Those Under 18 Years Old

Dr. John R. Harris announced this week that he now has enough Salk vaccine on hand to give the shots to everybody, up to 18 years of age, who wants them. He said the shots will be given for \$2.00 each, which is only slightly more than the cost of the vaccine.

Children and young people who want to take the shots may take one now, another in one month and

the third in six more months.

Dr. Harris said that he has not received vaccine which is to be used for the third shot for second and third graders. These shots were being given free of charge, with the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis furnishing the vaccine. The doctor said that he would inquire into the matter and would announce when the third free shots will be available as soon as he learns. However, those persons who wish to give the third shots to their children now may have them for the \$2.00 price.

Second round shots to first and second graders were given in late July.

Children in the first and second grades all over the United States were given the shots free of charge as part of the testing of the effectiveness of the new vaccine.

## New Baptist Pastor Will Fill Pulpit Sunday

The Rev. Douglas G. Brown has accepted the pastorate of First Baptist Church. He and his wife are coming here from Snyder and will take residence at the parsonage Friday. He will be present to fill the pulpit on Sunday.

Brown is 32 years old and a native of Snyder. He received his BD degree from California Baptist Theological Seminary and served 4½ years as pastor of Devore Baptist Church at San Bernadino, Calif.

Mrs. Brown is also a graduate of the California school, receiving a B. A. degree. She has been teaching the first grade in Snyder but has resigned her position to move to Bronte.

## Park Fund Being Discussed for Coke

Work is being done in both Robert Lee and Bronte toward instituting a park program for the county. Mayor Ernest Ivey, Bob Wilson and Ben Oglesby went to a meeting in Robert Lee Tuesday night to discuss the matter with citizens of that city who are working on the project.

W. W. Greif, who has been employed by Coke County for several construction jobs, met with the group and presented tentative plans for a park and swimming pool at Robert Lee. He plans to come to Bronte the last of this week and make surveys for a similar project at Bronte.

Tentative plans call for park improvement, and construction of a swimming pool, bath houses and other recreation facilities.

County officials are of the opinion that the park program can be financed with no additional taxes, in that county valuations have increased to around \$30 million.

More details on the project will be carried in The Enterprise each week as they are worked out.

## 40 New Street Lights to Be Erected in Bronte

In a recent meeting of the city council of Bronte, it was voted to accept recommendation of lighting engineers of West Texas Utilities Co. and have approximately 40 more street lights erected in Bronte. The WTUC men told members of the council that this number of additional lights would do a good job of lighting the entire town.

Work on the project is expected to start in the near future. It will begin with the erection of 13 lights, to be placed on church street and on the street where the school is located. Those on school street will be placed south of the building, toward the football field.

West Texas Utilities representatives estimated that the city can have the additional lights for approximately \$50 per month. This will bring the total for street lighting close to \$75 per month. Members of the council were of the opinion that the city can afford to pay up to \$75 for adequate street lighting.

The remainder of the lights will be erected throughout the residential district.

Four men have filed for the positions which become vacant on the city council this year. Mayor Ernest Ivey filed his name for re-election, as did Aldermen Ben Oglesby and Charlie Boecking. The other candidate is Billy Gene Thomas. Alderman Joe George Wilkins has not announced whether or not he will seek re-election to his post. Ivey, Oglesby and Boecking are completing their first term in city posts.

Three alderman jobs and the mayor's position are to be filled at an election on Tuesday, April 3. Candidates have until 30 days before the election to file their names with the city secretary and fill out the necessary forms. The deadline is March 5.

D. K. Glenn has been appointed judge for the city election. It will be held at the city hall.

## Last Rites Held For Mrs. Hudgens

Funeral services for Mrs. Ina Hudgens, 70, long time San Angelo resident, were held at 2 p. m. Tuesday in First Presbyterian Church, U. S. , in San Angelo with the Rev. Rodney Gibson, pastor, officiating. Burial was in Fairmount cemetery there under direction of Cox Funeral Home.

Mrs. Hudgens died early Sunday at her home of a heart attack. She had had one attack last year.

Mrs. Hudgens was born March 23, 1885, in Christoval and attended school in San Angelo. She was married to Dick C. Hudgens Feb. 14, 1904, in Christoval.

The couple lived in Christoval and Eldorado before returning to San Angelo in 1908. Mr. Hudgens died in 1922.

She was a member of the Presbyterian Church and Presbyterian Women's Association.

She was well known in Bronte, having spent much time here in the home of her daughter, Mrs. C. E. Arrott.

Survivors include five sons, Alvin G., M. Glenn and John E. Hudgens, all of San Angelo, Ray Hudgens of Midland and Melvin J. Hudgens of Christoval; two daughters, Mrs. Arrott of Bronte and Miss Hazel Hudgens of San Diego, Calif.; two brothers, two half-brothers and eight grandchildren.

Coke County's quota for this year has not been announced but will be made public in a few days.

## Retail Sales Increase in Coke

Retail sales in Coke County during 1954 were up 81.6 per cent over 1948, when the last business census was taken. The increase was reported in a 1954 preliminary census report recently released by the Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce.

Retail sales during 1954 totaled \$4,140,000, according to the report and covered 52 stores. The 1948 report, which covered 63 retail establishments, showed sales of \$2,280,000.

Stores with a payroll in 1954

numbered 36 and they had a total of 130 employees, with a payroll of \$318,000. These 36 stores accounted for sales of \$3,436,000. Proprietors of unincorporated businesses numbered 59.

Following below are the various groups of business, their number and the amount of sales made by each group. Two categories are marked (D); this indicates that figures are withheld to avoid disclosure. Automobile dealers accounted for more retail sales than any other group, with food stores

ranking in second place.

Eating drinking places, 4, \$71,000

General merchandise group, 6, \$143,000.

Furniture, home furnishings, appliances, 2, (D).

Automotive group, 4, \$1,355,000.

Gasoline service stations, 10, \$345,000.

Lumber, bldg. matls., hdw., farm equipment, 5, \$757,000.

Drug stores, proprietary stores, 3, \$301,000.

Other retail stores, 4, (D).

3 beaten egg yolks  
1 15-oz. can sweetened condensed milk  
1 cup applesauce  
3 to 4 tbsps. lemon juice  
½ tps. grated lemon peel  
3 tsiffly beaten egg whites

Combine ½ cups crumbs, butter and sugar. Mix well. Press on bottom and sides or 8x12-inch baking dish. Combine egg yolks, milk, applesauce, lemon juice and peel; mix well. Fold in stiffly-beaten egg whites. Pour into crumb crust and sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Bake in moderate oven (325 degrees) 45 minutes.

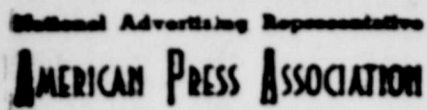

New Microscope Will Aid In Cancer Study

HOUSTON, Texas — A powerful new microscope which will aid in cancer study has been acquired by the University of Texas M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor In-

stitute. Objects which can be seen only by means of an ordinary microscope are magnified to the size of a four-story building by the new instrument, an electron microscope. The images produced are so sharp that a specimen can be photographically enlarged to 300,000 times its original size.

The \$28,000 instrument, installed with accessory equipment, was paid for by a \$35,000 gift of an anonymous Texas philanthropist.

Dr. Leon Dmochowski, virologist and experimental pathologist at Anderson Hospital, will supervise work with the new microscope. He has long been associated with the application of electron microscopy to cancer research, having conducted previous studies at the University of Leeds, England, and at Columbia University.

With the instrument, Dr. Dmochowski will seek an explanation of the structure of animal and human tumors. His studies will also include an investigation of eye cancer in cattle and of attempts to purify transmissible agents responsible for various tumors in animals.

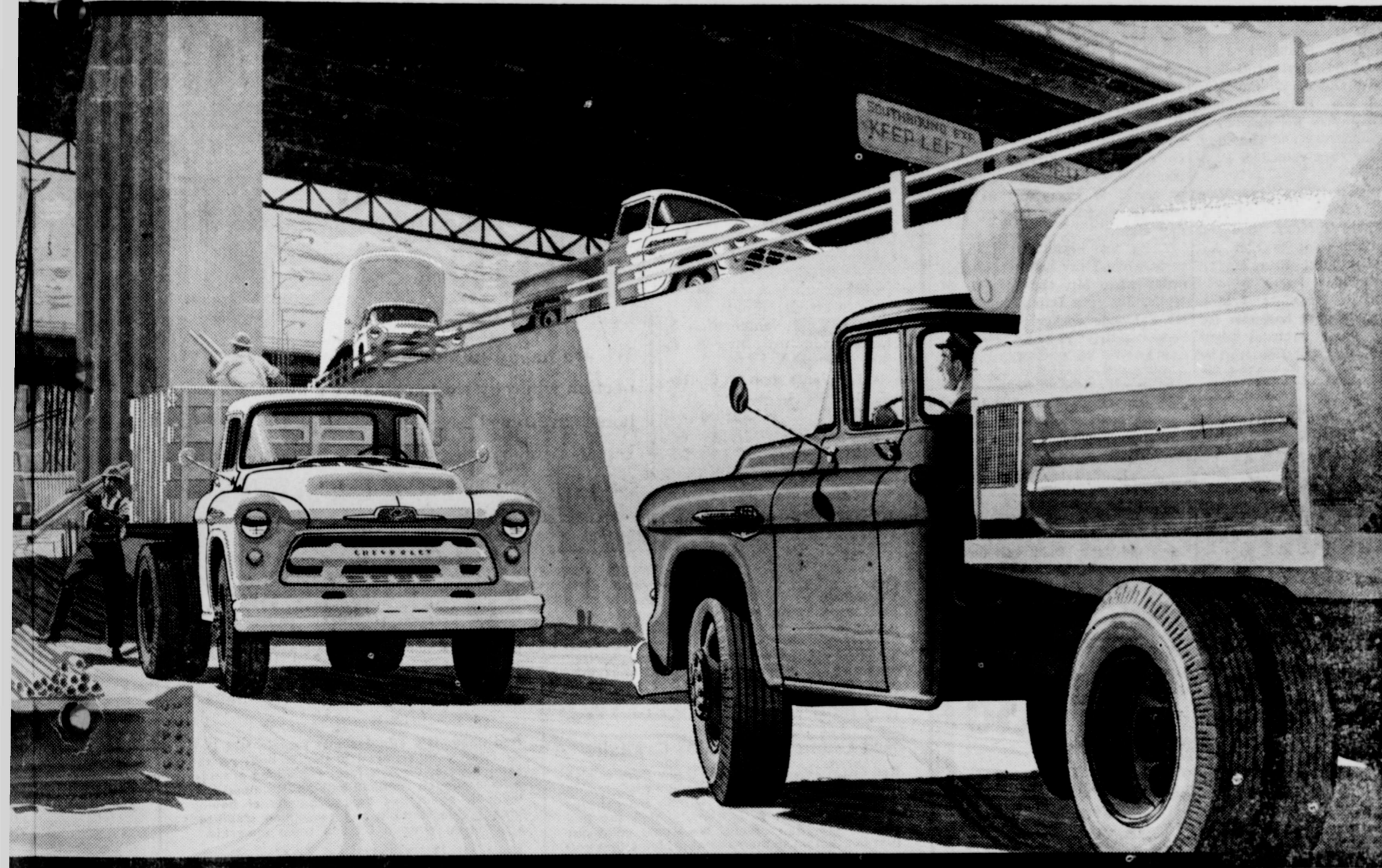

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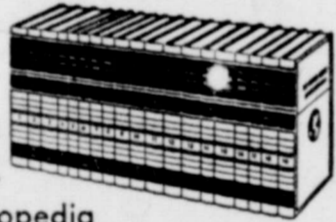
