OLD BUILDING COMING DOWN

The old building on the Bronte Schools campus is being rapidly demolished by workmen of John Burk Construction Co. The firm has contracted to tear down the old structure and clear the ground to make way for construction of the district's new \$325,000 building expansion program. The old structure was built in 1922.

Workers plan to have the building about leveled by Jan. 1, said Supt. C. B. Barbee this week.

Other work on the new structures is also progressing well, the superintendent said. The foundation has been poured for the new vocational agriculture building and footing for the new gymnasium and boiler room was poured Tuesday.

Students and teachers have doubled up in order to clear the old building. High School Principal Joe B. Simpson has moved his office into the nurse's office in the elementary building and class rooms have been rearranged to keep all classes on the campus during the construction period.

Barbee said that everyone is having to do quite a bit of walking between the elementary building and the south part of the old building, but "wa are happy to do it in order to get our new high school underway," he added.
