NOTICE!

THE GRAND JURY OF CASTRO COUNTY, TEXAS, recently in session has recommended and requested that notice in substantially the following form be published in the paper, to wit:

"It was found that quite a few people unthoughtedly threw junk consisting of glass, scrap iron, tin cans and dead animals along the country roads in the County. Usually such junk is placed in a bar ditch, where the county road maintainers have to run, and by virtue of the nature of road construction and working this junk is dragged in part to the roadbed proper. In this regard the junk is a hazard to the tires of road machinery and to the tires of the public, both of which are hard to get; and

as to dead animals they are largely chickens and hogs, some of the latter of which would likely be cholera hogs, and the neighborhood dogs could easily pollute three or four farms from one such carcass.

It is requested that all persons refrain from dumping either carcasses or junk on the county roads or hiways in the interest of all.

Your attention is further called to the fact that such dumping of junk and dead animals on the road is an offense which is in violation of the law and carries a heavy fine on conviction.
