The store, located at the intersection of Farm-to-market road 168 and State Highway 86, adjoins a service station owned by Harry Kleman, father of Robert Kleman, The father discovered the breakin when he went to the station shortly after 7 a.m. Saturday and found the cash register short by

Kleman then found a hole had been knocked in a wooden overnanging door through which the ourglars had reached to unlock the

Using tools from the service station, the thiefs knocked a hole about 21/2 feet square in the storeroom wall and went to work loading their truck. Clay said the thiefs were ap-




travelers of the nation. In the area of working with the nation's youth, the American Legion again stands out as a giant among






