Glenn said deposits might have been higher at some date than they were on Dec. 31, 1971, but they were higher at that time than ever before on a date for a report to the Comptroller of the Currency.

The deposits of \$3,593,803.23 on the last day of 1971 exceeded the \$3,233,034.89 on deposit Dec. 31, 1970, by \$360,768.34. The end of the year figure also exceeded the June 30, 1971, figure of \$3,241,-807.97 by \$351,995.26. It exceeded the Sept. 30, 1971, figure of \$3,-508,061.57 by \$85,741.66.

Loans have also increased during the past year. Out on loan on Dec. 31, 1971, was \$1,909,783.70, compared to \$1,468,770.79 on Dec. 31, 1970, an increase of \$441,012.91. This figure, when compared with the loans on June 30, 1971, of \$1,615,948.29, shows an increase of \$293,835.41. 
