rection of Newby Funeral Home. Mr. Ditmore was born April 13. 1894, in Tom Green County, He moved to Coke County in 1939 and was engaged in stock farming. He was elected commissioner from precinct four and served in that capacity 14 years. He was a member and past Worsmpful Master of Bronte Masonic Lodge and was past Worth Patron of Norton Eastern Star Chapter, but was a member of Bronte Chapter of the Eastern Star at the time of his death. He was a veteran of World War I.
