3. Many manufacturers of permanent press garments recommend machine washing and machine drying for best results. Following instructions on the garment tag can preserve the life of your clothing and give you wrinkle-free clothes without need for ironing. A big savings!
4. An important maintenance function for you to do is to clean the lint trap and lint filter on both washer and dryer after each load of a full day's use of your home laundry.
5. Never-Never pour bleach directly into the washer with clothes in it. Always dilute bleach before adding it to wash water. Also, timing is important. Bleach should be added after the clothes have washed at least 5 minutes.
