FISHING REPORT from Lake Spence

Paths and Wildlife Department fishery biologists are currently engaged in a striped bass "hunting" expedition at Lake Spence.

Each year, striped bass at Lake. Spence are caught and stripped of eggs during the spawning period. The eggs are hatched under hatchery conditions and the young fish are then made available to many lakes over the state.

Bill Follis, biologist in charge of the striped bass program at Spence, said last week that the largest female striper caught in nets so far was an 18 pounder.

Last spawning season, fishery men at Lake Spence hetched over two million young striped bass. Follis hopes this year's haul will amount to around three million.




