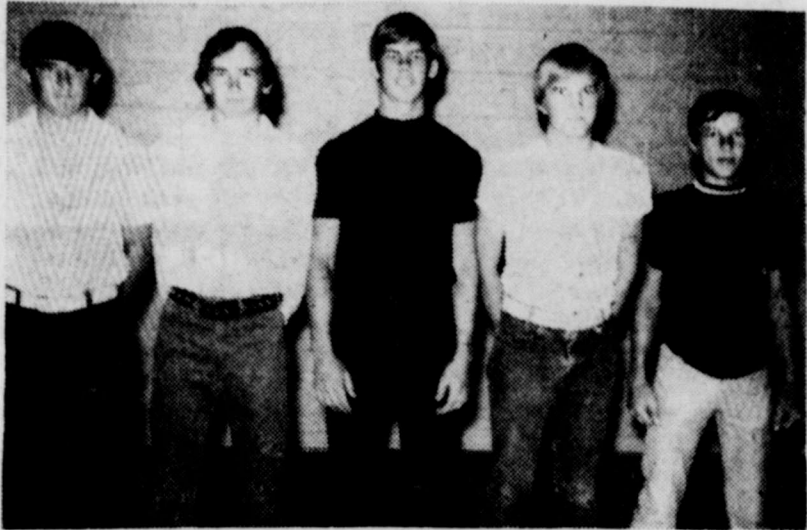

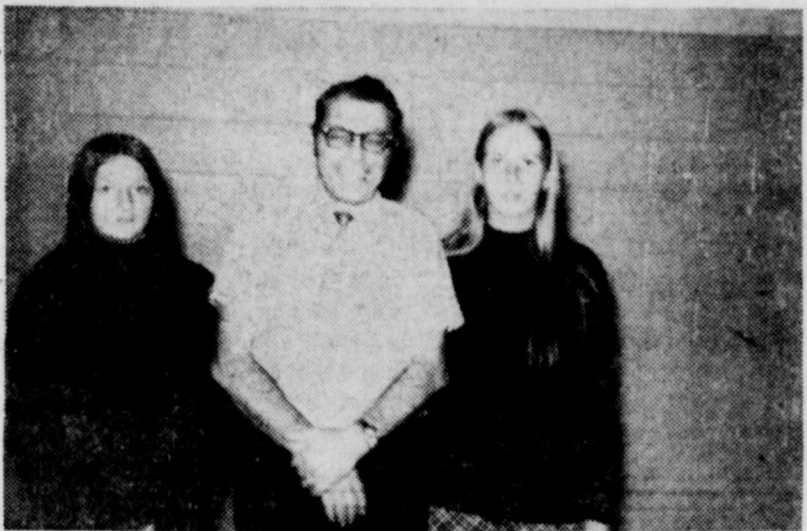

Caperton Is Mayor, School, Hospital District Elect

R. T. Caperton was elected mayor of Bronte Saturday along with two new and one incumbent aldermen. In the school election, held the same day, two new trustees were named and one was re-elected. In the hospital district election, also held Saturday, two incumbents and one new director were elected.

In the city election Caperton received 192 votes for mayor. For alderman, J. T. Henry received 197 votes; James Badgett 182; Ernest Aguero 107. A write-in for T. O. Spuler for alderman gave him 88 votes. A scattering of other write-in votes were counted in both mayor and alderman elections.

The race for school trustee was the hottest of the three elections held, with eight candidates seeking the three spots which were open. Elected were James O. Koenig with 152 votes; James A. Tidwell, the incumbent, with 121; and Bill Jackson with 112.

Other candidates received the votes shown: James W. Lee 110; Grady L. Coulter 101; Mrs. Nick (Susan) Arrott 86; A. D. McCarty 65; Ernest Aguero 37. A total of 267 votes were cast.

In the election for directors of East Coke County Hospital District 229 votes were cast. Roy Wayne Stout led the ticket with 225; Rev. C. R. Blake received 218 and LeDrew Arrott received 216.

The hospital district board met Tuesday night and new directors were sworn in. The board organized with Blake renamed president; Arrott was reelected vice president; and Stout was named secretary, replacing Dwain Pruitt, who did not seek the office.

New Mayor Caperton replaces Martin Lee, who has served four years in the office and was on the council several years before being elected mayor. Other outgoing councilmen are Mrs. Cecil Kemp and Tommy Lee.

New school board members replace Wayne Arrott and Billy Joe Luckett.

Ranger Doyle Scott Buried in Fairview

Texas Ranger Roy Doyle Scott, 39, died Thursday, April 4, in a Greenville hospital after a long illness. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Lee Roy Scott of Bronte.

Funeral services were held Saturday at 2 p.m. in Washington Street Baptist Church in Greenville, conducted by Texas Ranger Captain John Newton and Rev. Eeb Laymon. Rangers of Company B, Dallas region, were pallbearers and the honor guard. Burial was at 4 p.m. Sunday in Fairview Cemetery in Bronte.

Ranger Scott was born in Bronte and attended elementary school here. He graduated from Denver City High School where he was active in sports. After attending Howard County Junior College in Big Spring two years he was employed by the Texas Department of Public Safety as a highway patrolman for 13 years. He was stationed at Seminole, La

Marque and Austin. For two years he was security liaison for Governors John Connally and Preston Smith.

On Sept. 1, 1969, he was sworn in as a Texas Ranger, assigned to Company B in Dallas and held that position until his death.

Ranger Scott attended Alvin Junior College and the University of Houston. He completed his degree in pre-law at Southwest Texas State University. He served with the U. S. Army in Europe. He was a member of the Texas Sheriffs Association, the East Texas Police Officers Association, the North Texas Police Officials, the Optimist International and VFW.

He is survived by his wife, Vivian, and two sons, Roy Clayton, 10, and Kyle McWilliams, 8, and of Greenville; one sister, Shirley Scott Brown of Fort Worth; one brother, Troy Mac Scott of Denver City.

MRS. DEPPE'S HOME DESTROYED BY FIRE

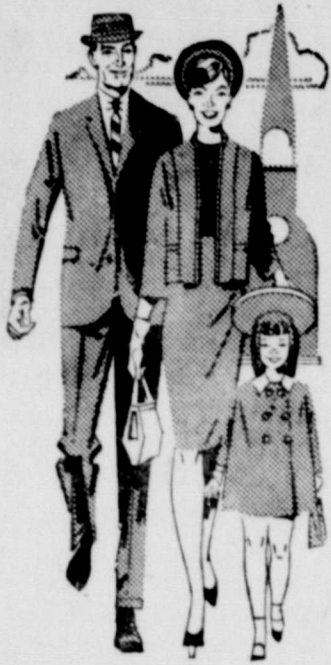
