### TRASH STILL A PROBLEM

Bronte city officials have a problem on their hands in regard to the city dump ground southwest of town. Some recommendations have been made by the Texas State Department of Health regarding the operation of the dump ground.

Mayor R. T. Caperton told The Enterprise that all the problems stem from the fact that citizens are scattering trash over the entrance area to the dumping ravine and not placing the trash in the proper place.

Michael W. Menzies of the State Health Department inspected the dump ground May 16 and his report prompted two recommendations:

1. An attendant should be on duty during operating hours to direct unloading of refuse, or appropriate signs should be posted to indicate where vehicles are to unload.

2. A gate should be erected and kept locked when an attendant is not on duty or when the facility is not open to the public.

Mayor Caperton added to the pleas that have come from city officials for many years, for the public to dump their trash into the ravine instead of scattering it all over the level approaches.

The subscription bargain time on The Bronte Enterprise is approximately two-thirds gone and lots of folks have already taken advantage of the 50 cents saving. However, there are a number of readers who have not subscribed as yet.

All subscribers are urged to get their orders in as soon as possible. Prices are \$3.50 in Coke County, and the immediate Bronte trade territory, reduced from the regular price of \$4.00; \$4.50 anywhere else in Texas, reduced from \$5.00;

Bronte residents will start paying a higher price for the water they use, beginning Saturday, July 20. The city council passed an ordinance raising the rates at a meeting July 11.

The minimum charge will remain at \$4.00 per month for those who use 3,000 gallons or less. Users of more than 3,000 will bear the load of the increased rates on the following schedule: after the first 3,000 gallons, the next 4,000 gallons will be 80 cents per thousand; the next 3,000 gallons

will be 70 cents per thousand; the next 5,000 gallons will be 60 cents per thousand; and all over 15,000 gallons will be 55 cents per thousand.

The old rates will still be in effect for water bills which are mailed Aug. 1, with the new rates being reflected the first time on bills mailed Sept. 1.

Mayor R. T. Caperton said the City Council felt a raise in water rates was necessary to offset the steadily rising prices of labor and all the material and equipment used in operating the water system. It has been eight years since water rates were raised in Bronte.

Also included in the ordinance were increased prices of water hauled by truck and in the price for tapping a water line.

Mayor Caperton said the city's water supply has improved a great deal since the installation of a booster pump last week. However, he emphasized that it is absolutely necessary to continue the rule of watering every other day.

**CITY ORDINANCE**

WHEREAS, the schedule of rates for water service now charged in the City of Bronte, Texas, has not increased in the last 8 years, and

WHEREAS, during the same period of time the costs of labor and materials have increased to the point where the revenue produced from the current schedule of rates is no longer sufficient to cover the increased cost, and

WHEREAS, the City Council seeks relief from this condition by an adjustment of its rates for services, and

WHEREAS, it now appearing to this city council that it is necessary and proper to prescribe a new schedule of rates or charges to be paid by the inhabitants of said City for services rendered by the City's Waterworks System:

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That the rates or charges for services furnished by the Waterworks System shall be as follows:

Effective as of the July 20, 1974, billing:

A minimum charge of \$4.00 monthly shall be charged with a

maximum allowance of 3000 gallons; the next 4000 gallons shall be 80c per thousand; the next 3000 gallons shall be 70c per thousand; the next 5000 gallons shall be 60c per thousand; and all over 15000 gallons shall be 55c per thousand.

SECTION 2: That in addition to and being a part of this Ordinance pertaining to the bulk water rate at the stand pipe, the rate shall be as follows:

Transport Truck load of Water, Per Load, \$10.00.

Bobtail Truck load of Water, (70 to 100 bbls), \$6.00.

Anything under 70 bbls., 5c per barrel.

Effective date for Section, being the same date voted on in regular meeting which was July 11, 1974, whereby the Council approved the bulk rate unanimously.

SECTION 3: That also in addition to and being a part of this Ordinance, the charge for tapping a water line shall be the sum of \$35.00 per tap.

Effective date for Section 3, being the same date voted on in regular meeting July 11, 1974, whereby the Council approved the charge unanimously.

SECTION 4: That such rates and charges hereby fixed and prescribed shall be paid by the users of the Waterworks System to the Water Department of the City of Bronte, Texas, by the 10th of each month, and which shall be

the date such rates or charges shall become due and payable; and in case a user or customer has not paid by the 10th of the month after having received notice, either verbal or written, and has not paid the due account within 30 days (by the 10th of the following month) services may be discontinued until the bill is paid in full, and whenever the amount past due and delinquent is paid, services may be resumed, but there shall be charged and collected a reconnection fee of \$2.00. Failure to receive bill doesn't extend delinquent date.

SECTION 5: Let it be known that this ordinance does not revoke any part of that certain Waterworks Ordinance adopted 16th day of June, 1952, but only amends that particular ordinance.

SECTION 6: By reason of the fact that the City Council considers the passage necessary for the economy and welfare of the citizens of Bronte, it is hereby declared duly constituted by this City Council and shall have an effective date as of the billing for July 20, 1974. And be it so ordained.
