#### Pack Wisely for Vacation

Vacation travel often means living out of a suitcase for a week or two—but it won't be hard to keep clothes looking nice if you follow these secrets to successful packing.

Basically, try to choose clothes like knits that travel well and learn to pack carefully.

A 24 to 26 inch suitcase is best for a long trip because it will be large enough to keep carefully packed clothes in good condition.

\* When you are ready to pack, lay out everything you plan to take or think you will need.

\* Separate these things into like groups.

\* To make all space count, put small things, or hose, inside shoes.

\* Belts and small accessories go in the bottom of the bag. Shoes and bulky things, on the bottom toward the back.

\* Fill the corners with undergarments or wrinkle proof articles.

\* The real secret is to smooth off the top and make a flat surface for dresses and blouses.

Now for the dresses:

\* Close all openings on the dress. Lay it flat, front down. Spread tissue over the entire dress.

\* Measure the suitcase length. Then if possible, make only one crosswise fold in your dress.

\* Avoid folding dresses or any garment down the center front or center back.

\* In general, pack the things you'll need first, such as nightgowns or slippers, on top in the suitcase.

### Badley Employed By City to Help Trash Problem

Steve Badley has been employed by the City of Bronte to assist local residents in disposing of trash at the dump ground southwest of town. He will work at the dump ground three days a week, on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.

Mayor R. T. Caperton said Badley will be available to show persons where to dump their refuse. He asked that everyone cooperate with the new city employee and try to make the dump ground a more convenient place to dispose of trash.

Caperton said that all trash placed in barrels and incinerators should be burned before it will be picked up. The mayor also urged everyone who hauls leaves and grass to the dump ground to be sure to dump them in the ravine so they can be burned later.

State Health Department officials have told city fathers that something must be done to clean up the dump ground, and they are hopeful this latest move will enable the city to meet the state standards.

The City Council passed a new ordinance at their meeting Aug. 1, concerning the trash and garbage problem. Among its provisions is a new rate of \$1.00 per month to be charged Bronte residents for hauling trash. The old fee was 50 cents per month.

#### SAVINGS BOND SALES AT 40% OF 1974 GOAL

June sales of Series E and H United States Savings Bonds amounting to \$1,674 in Coke County were reported this week by County Bond Chairman G. C. Allen. Sales for the six month period totaled \$12,099 for 40 per cent of the 1974 goal of \$30,000.

Sales in Texas during the month amounted to \$17,074,815 while sales for the first half of 1974 totaled \$116,443,089 with 49 per cent of the yearly goal of \$236.8 million achieved.

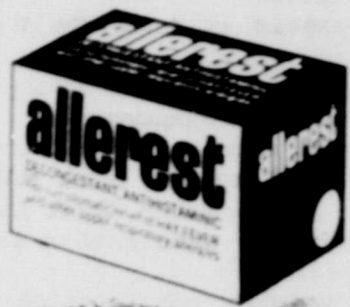

## "FAITH HEALER HOLDS ALL NIGHT SESSION"

(News as it might have been written if there had been newspapers 1900 years ago.)

The Jewish "Faith Healer" named Paul held an all-night session here last night with the local group of "Christians." This sect claims that their leader, Jesus, is still alive, though he was executed several years ago in Jerusalem after being convicted of blasphemy.

Paul seems to be the leader of this fanatical sect. He travels incessantly and usually stirs up trouble wherever he goes.

Local authorities have been warned to be on the lookout for him and to watch carefully for rioting when he comes to town.

Last night's session was held in a local hall rented by the group for the occasion. A large crowd was present. One young man named Eutyclus who lives here, was seated in an upstairs window.

Paul harangued the crowd for several hours and Eutyclus went to sleep and fell out the window to the pavement below. His friends say he was "dead." And that Paul came down and prayed for him and "brought him back to life." When interviewed today, Eutyclus couldn't remember much of what happened, only that he had been sitting in the window, and was later lying in the street, un-hurt.
