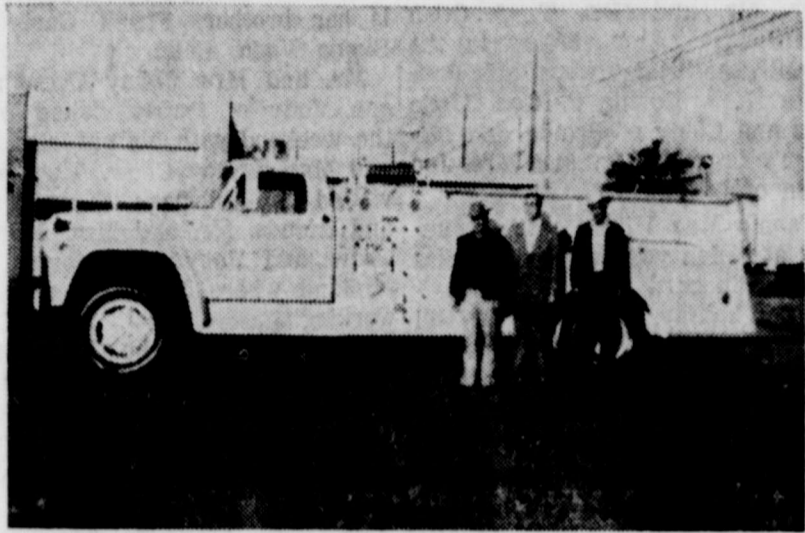

FFA TO SPONSOR PET VACCINATION DAY

The Bronte FFA Chapter will sponsor a rabies vaccination day February 14. Dr. John Hodges of San Angelo will be in Bronte at the Vocational Agricultural Building on that day to give the shots. Hours will be from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The local chapter is sponsoring this event to help people comply with a city ordinance requiring all animals be vaccinated. Local residents are urged to mark this date and have their pets vaccinated at this time.

The truck was bought at a cost of \$27,000.00 but the additional equipment brought the total price to \$30,000.00. Money for the purchase of the truck came from Coke County revenue sharing which provided \$15,000; city revenue sharing \$9,000 and the Volunteer Fire Department which gave \$6,000.

The new truck has a 750 gallon tank and is capable of pumping 750 gallons of water per minute. It meets all requirements of the State Board of Insurance. The truck will be used within the city limits only. The new piece of equipment will help cut the city's key insurance rate.

Mayor R. T. Caperton and the Bronte City Council played important rolls in the purchase of the new truck. The City is now one of the best equipped for its size as any town in Texas. Local citizens are invited to come by the fire station and inspect the new truck.

Bronte Girls Capture District Championship

Bronte High School girls basketball team has captured the 25-B title for the second straight year. The girls defeated Hawley last Thursday night 48-40 and then clinched the crown with a 63-42 win over Trent Tuesday night.

The Hawley game saw the local girls trailing by 4 points at the end of three quarters, but a big 19-point outburst in the final eight minutes sealed the win. Sherrie Coalson had 17 of the final quarter points and finished with 33 for the night. Shelley Cumbie chipped in with 9 points while Km Glascock had 4 and Leah Barbee 2. The game was played in the local gym. In the game played Tuesday night at Trent Coalson again led all

scorers with 25. Cumbie had 12, Barbee 15, Marla Thompson 4, Glascock 3 and Gene Mansfield and Shelene Tidwell 2 each. Guards turning in good defensive play in the two games were Laura

Sheriff J. L. Ensor this week authorized this newspaper to announce that he will be a candidate to re-election. The sheriff had served only a partial term after having been appointed to serve the unexpired term of Doug Robertson, who resigned to take a position with the Department of Public Safety.

Ensor had been serving as Robertson's head deputy when he was named head law enforcement officer of Coke County.

Ensor's wife, Delma, is employed by the Bronte School. They have five children. Marvin, who is out of school, and Bill, Tom, Pete and Kathy, who are students in the Bronte schools.

In making his bid for re-election, Sheriff Ensor had the following statement to make:

"It has been by desire during the time I have served as your sheriff, to make every effort to serve all the people fairly and justly at all time. It is our job to enforce the law, and all of our personnel try to do this.

"I have served as your sheriff only a few months, but I have tried to do you a good job and make you a good hand. If you see fit to re-elect me to this office, I shall continue to try to serve each citizen fairly and honestly, and without prejudice.

"I certainly will appreciate your vote and your influence toward giving me a full elective term. And, in return, I promise a good, honest day's work for every day I am in office."

Ensor's candidacy is subject to action by Coke County voters at the Democratic Primary in May.

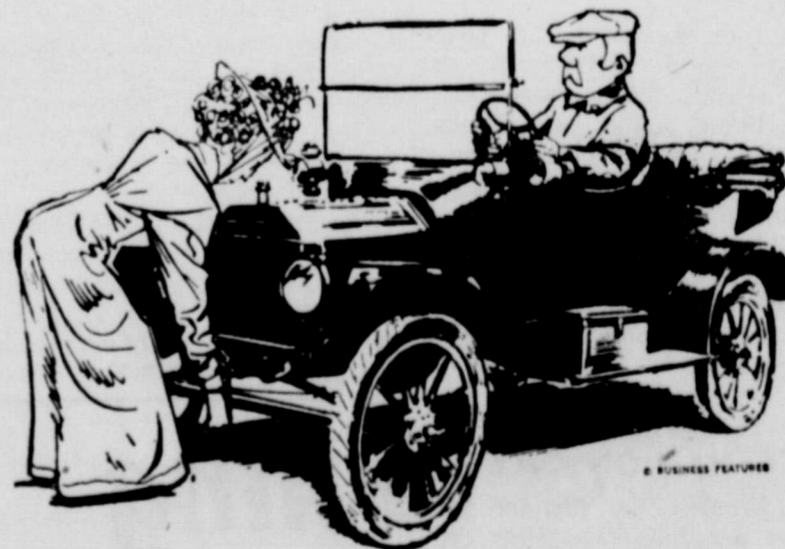

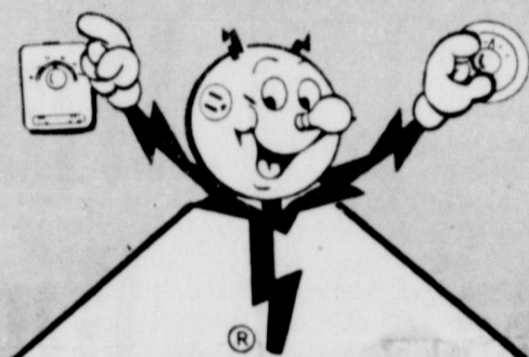

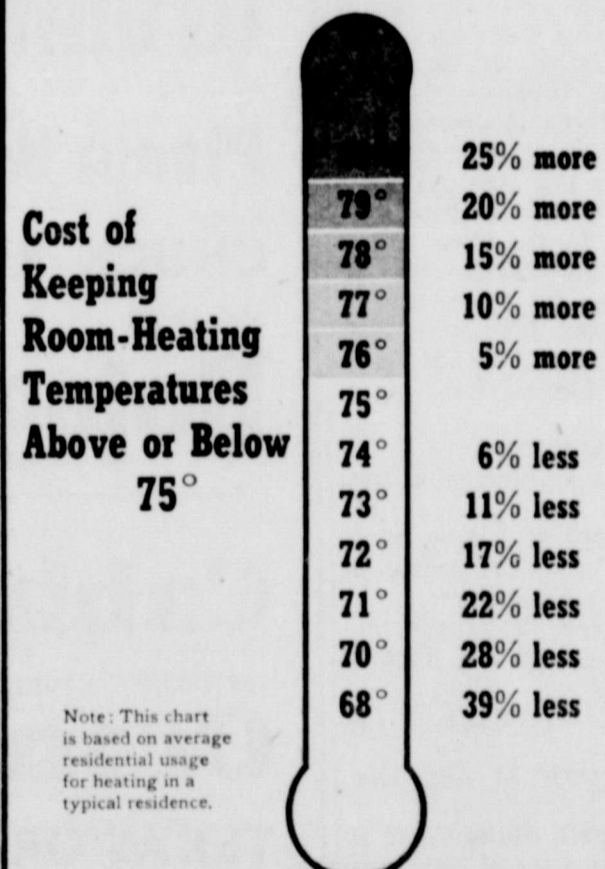
