#### YOUNG TEXANS URGED TO REGISTER

AUSTIN—Workers in a statewide voter registration drive are making a concerted effort to reach young Texans, according to Sec. of State Mark White, who is directing the registration project.

White says statistics indicate Texans between the ages of 18 and 20 participate in elections less than any other population segmen, with the 21-24 year bracket following close behind.

"We have contacted officials in virtually every high school in Texas, and we are now trying to organize registration drives in most colleges," White said. "Young Texas represent a large pool of the electorate that remains untapped, and we hope to register a large percentage by the October 1 dead. line for registering to vote in the Presidential election."

White contends that most people, regardless of age, tend to vote once they complete the process of registering.

"Studies indicate that between 80 and 90 percent of registered voters do vote," White said. "All it takes to register in Texas is filling out a postcard, so if we can get our message to the people, we should see an upswing in Texas voting performance, which has been falling steadily for more than a decade."


Registration applications are available through county tax assessors or by calling White's office in Austin toll-free at 1-800-292-9602.
