The State Democratic Excutive Com mittee, under date April 13, issues the
following notice to county chairmen for their guidance and information in
regard to the selection of delegates to regard to the selection of delegates
attend the State Convention which to meet in Waco on May 27, for the purpose of selecting delegates to the Precinct Conventions May 3 1. A precinct primary convention
should be held in each voting precinct of the county on Saturday, May 3, be tween the hour of ten oclock a. $m$, and eight oclock p. m. The precinct
chairman should designate the hour and place for holding said precinct convention. When the precinct con vention meets it shouild be presided over by said chairman, and after electing its secretary and such other offcers as may be necessary to its proper
organization, it shall proceed to elect its delegates to the County Convention and transact such other business as may properly come before it. The
officers of said precinct conventio hould keep a written record of it proceedings, including a list of the elegates elected to the county convenion, which record constitutes the re urns from said convention. This re cord should be signed officially, seal County Chairman and same will the e used by county chairman in making up a roll of the delegates to the coun $y$ convention. No one shall vote or unless he or she be a qualified vote in such precinct.

County Convention May 6th. 2. On Tuesday, May 6th. the vari-
ous delegates elected in the precinct conventions will meet at a time and place to be designated by your committee (usually the court house) and after the county convention has been
called to order and duly organized by called to order and duly organized
the selection of the necessary officers t shall proceed to ed thes such other business as may properly come before it. The officers of said County Convention should cause to be kept a written record of its proceed to the State Convention, and as soon s the convention adjourns said recor should be signed officially and trans mitted by registered mail immediately to the State Democratic Executiv Committee at Waco, Texas. 3. While no specific provision er 11 of Title 49 concerning the num ber of delegates to be selected in the precinct convention or in the county convention, it is suggested that not less than one delegate for each twenty ve votes cast for governor in the lection, and that the county conven tion in turn select not less than one delegate to the State Convention for each 300 votes that were cast for gov-
ernor in your county in the last pre rnor in your county in the last pr eding primary election ist of delegates to the State Conven tion be transmitted to our Committe at Waco, Texas, immediately after the County Convention adjourns. This necessary in order that we may hav uffficient the State Convention on redited delegates and your co-oper ation in this respect will be greatiy appreciated.

If a vote were to be taken to decide what is the most popular book in the world the Bible would be named by
he vast majority. Although the Bible ine vast majority. Although the Bible one of the oldest books in the world, less millions of copies, yet it still re
tains its great popularity, and is still the best seller" at all the good book tores. Is there any other book that an approach this splendid record?
Before the invention of movable Before the invention of movable type Germany, about the year 1455, copies of the Bible had to be produced by the hand-lettered process, or by means of engraved wooden blocks. But with Gutenberg's wonderful investion it wa possible to print unlimited numbers the Bible at comparatively small ex
pense. Ever since the production of Gutenberg's now famous " 42 -Line Bible" the Bible pupbishing business
has been constantly increasing and doubtless it will keep on expanding un ill the end of time. The 42-Line Bible derives its name each of the two columns on every page consists of forty-two lines of printed words. The type used for this work
was cut by Gutenburg in the style of the "rok-Gothic letters of the fifteenth eentury. It has been estimated by expert printers that more than 125,000
individual type characters were required to print this book, which was made up of 641 leaves, or 1,282 printed pages. There were two editions of this irst printed volume-one printed on
paper and the other on vellum. The size of each page is about $12 \times 18$. inches. Only about 210 copies of this first and 30 copies on velltam.
