I rejoice with Brother Bates and the citizens of Robert Lee and Coke county in their success in building their church. I also am glad they have voted prohibition. In fact I rejoice in Coke county's success in everything good.

TO THE TEACHERS.

The Institute work of the State is of the greatest importance to you and to the schools which you are teaching. Arkansas spends \$10,000 a year in support of her teacher's institutes; Michigan, \$12,572; Ohio, \$22,614; Illinois, \$23,301; Kansas, \$38,778; Iowa, \$61,921; New York, \$110,000, and other states various sums.

These states also spend from \$32,000 to \$38,072 in support of state Normal Schools for the training of their teachers. Texas teachers out of their meager earnings, not averaging more than \$240.00 annually, have been spending more than \$50,000 yearly supporting the Summer Normal Institutes and attending them.

Texas could well afford to appropriate \$20,000 each year out of her school funds for the support of her Summer Normal Institutes and thereby make them free to all her teachers. This sum is less than the expense of the schools for a half day. Such an appropriation, while it would not in fact reduce the term of a single school, would greatly improve the teaching throughout the State.

To the great majority of teachers, the Summer Normal Institutes afford the best opportunities for self improvement and mutual assistance. But many teachers who have been willing and ever eager to attend these institutes have been prevented from doing so on account of the expense.

The State by its law requires the teachers to attend the institutes. Therefore, it certainly should support them and place them within the reach of every teacher.

It is not deemed necessary to appeal to you to arouse your interest in this subject. A mere suggestion that you have an opportunity to do the schools a valuable service is sufficient to arouse your active interest. The legislature has been asked to make an appropriation for the Summer Institutes, and you could no doubt aid in securing this appropriation by writing, and asking some of your friends to write, to your Senator and Representative, urging the importance of this work and the necessity of such an appro-

priation. I make no request, as I prefer to leave you entirely free to act as may seem to you right and proper.

Will you please let me know your action in regard to this matter?

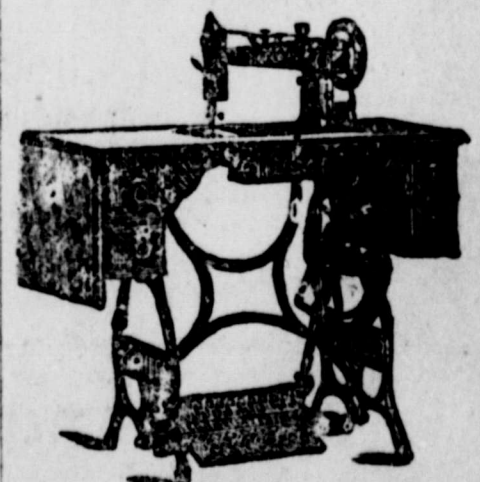
