down his throat is a job to tax any man's temper. You can save a lot of cuss words and the dog a lot of misery if you will take hold of the mutt's jaw,
press his cheeks a aainst his oeeth press his cheeks against his teeth so that he can'
close his mouth, and toss the pill far back in his throat Then, quickly clamp the jaws together and stroke his throat until he swallows.
You can almost see the pill slide down.

TIME TO HUNT SQUIRRELS-This tip is mean for the beginner who is taking his first squirrel hunt.
