## An Instrum

 FINDER.Lont, it it Claimed, the Fluld. Houston, Tex., July 18.-The techntcal name of the instrument was not earned, but a very interesting account

erved to be convinclag. There is in his section another instrument for lothe one of Mr. Callender. In appearance it looked as if made by placing ace, a very small crack between them and evidently something inside. From ne side of the blvalve projects a me-
allic bar about the size of an ordinary quare knife handle, but longer. From the opposite side project two pieces of
square whalebone somewhat larger han a pencil and maybe twice as long These whalebones, when the instru-
