WILL GET TEN CENTS FOR COTTON

Chief Clerk of Department of Agriculture Expresses Such as His Belief

"I believe that the farmers here today holding their cotton for 10 cents a pound will get at price. I believe that for the season during the last few years the speculators, playing the part of the middlemen, have gotten 10 cents and more for cotton that they purchased from the cotton raisers for a great deal less than that amount. The same conditions that prevail today prevailed during the seasons when cotton brought 10 cents and more later in the season."

Colonel S. R. Burch, chief clerk in the department of agriculture at Washington, so expressed himself yesterday afternoon. Colonel Burch and Judge R. W. Hickman, chief of the bureau of animal industry of the department of agriculture, are both in Fort Worth. They are here for the purpose of examining the employes of the bureau of animal industry stationed here for promotion. All these employes at the City at the packing plants will find a Burch and Judge Hickman will visit the packeries this morning and inspect the work that is being done.

The position that is being taken by the cotton growers of the South with regard to holding their staple is creating considerable discussion in departmental circles and the outcome will be viewed with interest," continued Colonel Burch. "Of course, my opinion is worth no more than the opinion of anyone else, but when I say that I believe that the farmers will get 10 cents for their cotton I but speak what all who have observed the trend of affairs during the last few years believe."

"Judge Hickman and myself are here as an auxiliary board of the civil service examination board. We will investigate the work that is being done by the employes of the bureau of animal industry at this point. We are making a tour over the entire country and from here will go to Albuquerque, N. M. We have already covered the central and eastern states. Our main aim is to select employes for promotion and advancement when vacancies occur. A man's experience and the manner he performs his work

counts for a great deal in making these promotions. We will have an examination at the packing houses Friday morning.

Against Roosevelt.

Denver, Colo., Oct. 31.—The Federated Unions of Colorado, through their president, tonight issued an appeal to their fellow workman in the United States to vote against Roosevelt on election day. The appeal says in part: "In Russianized Colorado the wage earners are awaiting your action with hearts tense, strong with hope and with unswerving faith in your loyalty. Local interests or party prejudice cause you to forget, we appeal to you at this supreme moment to remember Colorado, remember our sufferings, remember that the Republican party is responsible for our wrongs and our country's disgrace."

"Let no specious plea of Roosevelt's supposed friendship for labor blind you to those facts in the story of our wrongs. "From the land of bull pens and bayonets, of blacklists and deportations, labor of Colorado calls to the labor of the nation for help. Strike down with your votes the strenuous advocate of war, militarism and empire."

West Texas Wool Growing.

It has been pretty well known for some time past that Texas captured the gold medal awarded for the best wool exhibited at the World's Fair at St. Louis. It was officially announced last week that George Richardson of San Angelo was the lucky man.

And the awarding of this premium to a Concho Country wool raiser speaks in most eloquent language of the possibility of the Concho valleys of West Texas becoming one of the best, if not the best, wool producing sections of America. This is a bold statement, but it is justifiable. The prize won by Mr. Richardson was competed for by wool men from the United Kingdom, from Germany, from Australia, from New Zealand, and in fact from all wool producing countries of the world, and the awarding of the gold medal to a Texan makes a report of the circumstances connected with the raising of this premium wool interesting to all engaged in the industry. By persistent effort for many years Mr. Richardson has succeeded in getting the best Delaine sheep that could be found. Careful and scientific breeding has produced one of the best flocks of sheep in the world. These sheep shear from 9 to 10 pounds of long staple wool per year. The muttons of this flock fatten when 4 to 5 years of age, weigh 90 to 105 pounds, and command excellent prices on the Kansas City and St. Louis markets. These sheep are hardy and well adapted to the range.

The sheep producing the wool that was pronounced the best in the world at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition were not housed and fed as were some sheep that yielded wool from which competition came. Geo. Richardson's sheep were simply grazed on the range and got only that which mother nature provided. Now the dry winter and spring of last year were probably the worst experienced within the past decade. The capturing of the first prize, therefore, is evidence pure and simple that this country is destined to become still more prominent as a sheep producing land.

The feat speaks well also for the system of breeding employed by the Texan. Mr. Richardson has spent thirty years in the sheep and wool business. The knowledge gained by experience

tells the story of victory in a few simple syllables.

The awardment helps not only the lucky individual, but all of those following the industry in Texas. Indeed it benefits the state at large. It lends assistance to all those who are breeding their flocks to a higher plane.

With the price of wool, higher now than it has been for 14 or 15 years, it is indeed a most opportune time for those of West Texas to take such a prominent stand. It helps in another way. It necessarily attracts the attention of eastern wool manufacturers to the sterling worth of West Texas wool.

The old adage runneth: "It's seldom a Scotchman goes after anything but that he gets it." And the adage is certainly applicable in this instance. We cannot, therefore, refrain from congratulating our Scottish friend, George, upon the honor he has won for himself and the wool raisers of the grand old, opulent Concho Country.—San Angelo Standard.

ROOSEVELT FAIRBANKS

Republicans Gain a Sweeping Victory in Election.

TEDDY RULES AGAIN

Returns Up to Midnight Show That Roosevelt and Fairbanks Have a Total of 293 Votes in the Electoral College.

New York, Nov. 8.—From returns on hand at this hour the electoral vote stands as follows:

For Roosevelt—California, 10; Connecticut, 7; Delaware, 3; Illinois, 27; Indiana, 15; Iowa, 13; Kansas, 10; Maine, 6; Massachusetts, 16; Michigan, 14; Minnesota, 11; Nebraska, 8; New Hampshire, 4; New York, 39; New Jersey, 12; North Dakota, 4; Ohio, 23; Oregon, 4; Pennsylvania, 34; Rhode Island, 4; South Dakota, 4; Vermont, 4; Washington, 5; Wisconsin, 13; Wyoming, 3. Total, 293.

For Parker—Alabama, 11; Arkansas, 9; Florida, 5; Georgia, 13; Kentucky, 13; Louisiana, 9; Mississippi, 10; Missouri, 18; North Carolina, 12; South Carolina, 9; Tennessee, 12; Texas, 18; Virginia, 12. Total, 151.

Doubtful or not heard from—Colorado, 5; Idaho, 3; Maryland, 8; Montana, 3; Nevada, 3; Utah, 3; West Virginia, 5. Total, 32. Necessary to elect, 239.

FROM NEW YORK.

New York, Nov. 8, 8:45 p. m.—Latest figures from New York state and city indicate that Roosevelt's plurality above the Bronx is about 265,000 and Parker's below the Bronx is 37,000, giving the state to Roosevelt by 228,000. Returns from about one-third of the state above the Bronx show Republican vote to be 17,000 heavier than McKinley's four years ago and Parker's 7,000 smaller than Bryan's. For governor Higgins is apparently 165,000, Higgins will be elected governor by about 85,000. The legislature is unusually overwhelmingly Republican, assuring the election of a Republican senator.

PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT.

Washington, Nov. 8.—President Roosevelt tonight after the election returns clearly in the result, issued the statement: "I am to the honor done by the people thus confidence in"

WEATHER AT WORLD'S FAIR.

Cool Nights and Delightful Indian Summer to Be Expected at St. Louis.

Usually the warmest month of the year, July proved to be one of the most pleasant of the World's Fair season, the average temperature being 67 degrees, a record lower than that made by either Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Cincinnati or Chicago. The weather bureau records show that the temperatures in St. Louis during July were just between the extremes recorded at New Orleans and St. Paul, cities located at great variance.

August in St. Louis is a month of cool nights, and September and October are the most delightful months of the year. It is that period known as Indian summer, when the foliage and birds linger to challenge the coming winter. Nowhere on the American continent is there a spot more delightful than the World's Fair city, a garden of blooming flowers and spraying fountains.

St. Louis, like all cities, experienced several hot days during July, but the highest temperature recorded was 93 degrees against 94 degrees registered by the thermometer at Chicago. On the same day the mercury rose to 93 degrees in Philadelphia, and scores of heat prostrations were reported from New York and Boston.

The relative humidity shows St. Louis to be about normal. Assuming absolutely no moisture in the atmosphere to be zero and absolute wetness to be 100, the relative humidity for July, taken from the records of more than twenty years, Boston shows 70.6, New York 72.2, Philadelphia 96.6, Cincinnati 64.3, Chicago 66.9 and St. Louis 68.3. The same degree of heat in two places, with different degrees of humidity, would cause it to seem the hotter at the point of greater density.

CONCERTS BY MASSES BANDS

Prices Aggregating \$30,000 to Be Distributed at the World's Fair. Never were musical events in America planned upon such an elaborate scale as those of the World's Fair. A series of concerts will be given by competing bands in contest for prizes offered by the World's Fair. These contests will take place in Festival Hall, Sept. 12 to 17.

Nine cash prizes, aggregating \$30,000, are offered for the successful bands. The prizes are divided so as to give to the organization scoring the highest number of points \$3,250; \$2,500 will be given to the band scoring the second highest number of points and \$1,500 to the one getting the third highest number.

The above division is made for bands in Class A, which consist of twenty members. In the B class \$10,000 will be given in prizes—first, \$4,500; second, \$3,500; third, \$2,000. Class C, which includes bands of thirty-five members, will enjoy its division of \$12,700. For the organization scoring the highest number of points a prize of \$4,000 has been named. The second prize is \$4,000 and the third \$2,700.

Baldwin's Airship.
St. Louis, Oct. 31.—Roy Knabenschue of Toledo this afternoon made his second ascent from the World's Fair aeronautic concourse in T. S. Baldwin's airship, the "California Arrow."
When released the airship rose rapidly and evenly to a height of about 2,000 feet and was navigated in every direction, showing that the ship was entirely under control. A crowd of several thousand people in the concourse and about the World's Fair grounds watched the ascent. While at a great height the wheels of the airship, which are in the prow of the craft, could be plainly seen revolving at great speed as the operator steered into the wind. All parts of the machine seemed to be under complete control.
It was not the intention of Baldwin to make an extended flight, but to demonstrate to the assembled thousands the dirigibility of the airship.
After a flight of twenty-six minutes, during which time Knabenschue steered the ship in every direction, he returned to the concourse, breasting an eight-mile wind, and landed in the same spot from which the start was made.
Thousands of shouting spectators gathered about the airship and, taking it on their shoulders, attempted to carry it about the concourse, cheering for Knabenschue and calling for Baldwin.
The successful flight came as a climax to a day full of discouragements. Baldwin and Knabenschue had worked for twenty-six hours without sleep in order to prepare for the flight, and the airship, which had ended disastrously the day before, fell suddenly to the ground and breaking one of the blades of the propeller.
After a hasty examination, Baldwin announced that the damage could be repaired at once and said that Knabenschue would attempt another flight in half an hour. The crowd cheered the announcement and patiently awaited while the repairs were

being made.
At the time Baldwin had stated the airship was again brought from the aerodrome.
Captain Baldwin, after the flight, was extremely optimistic regarding the future of the airship. "I had about determined to leave St. Louis," said he. "In fact, we had taken the Arrow apart and had it packed ready for shipment when arrangements were made with the World's Fair company for additional flights.
"Now I will not be content to leave before I have had several trials for that \$100,000 prize. The conditions are rather severe, but I think the Arrow can make the required distance within the time limit."

From Tennyson.
In a recent issue of your paper I noticed you copied an article of mine on a Dipping Vat at San Angelo. Now, Mr. Editor, I have just returned from Kansas City where I watched closely the handling and sale of cattle on both sides of the river in southern or quarantine pens. I saw one buyer for calves and three for cattle mixed. I was there four hours. There is one buyer there from Elgin who buys only condemned cattle. A calf cow worth \$15.00 to \$20.00 here brings \$4.00 to \$6.00 just what he is willing to pay, as competition is limited we suffer. On the other hand over the river in the open market are many good buyers, why? In the first place quarantined cattle must be subject to immediate slaughter or returned to southern pastures, where there is already a supply of cattle. On the other hand the open market has farmers, stockmen, feeders, butchers and packers from all over the country. I saw over three year old steers sell for \$2.75 per 100 to \$3.00, weighing 900 pounds and better. In the open market I saw 500 pound steer yearlings bring \$3.25 per 100 pounds and 700 pound steer yearlings bring \$8.75 per 100, all Texas raised. Now brother cow puncher if you raise 1000 steers you lose from three to ten thousand dollars, or rather you get that much less than your more fortunate brother. Above the quarantine line now if the government will let you dip your cattle and give you a clearance bill to all open markets. I think we ought to be at it now, don't you. Every man who raises a calf is directly interested.
It has been slowly raining for some time and everything is very wet. Some cotton still in patch. General health of community is good. We have quite a good literary now. Preaching tonight and tomorrow by Bro. Jim Hicks. A Non.
