SLAUGHTER OF **INNOCENTS**

Thousands of Russians Who Have Hated Hebrews for Generations Become Drunk With a Desire For Jewish Blood.

Odesa, Nov. 4 .- The prefect of the city has issued a proclamation complaining of the inhabitants firing from the windows on patrols and declaring that he will be compelled to destroy their houses with articlery unless this practice is stopped.

1:49 p. m.-This city is quiet today and is almost assuming its the dataspect, but the tension is still great.
