ent of Education. State Depart To County Superintendents and Ex-Officio County Superintendents:

Your attention is respectfully nvited to sections 37, 42, 65, 71, 93 and 144 of the school laws of Texas, issue of 1905, and to the following rules and regulations of the State Department of Education, bearing upon the subject of county teachers institutes:

- 1. The county superintendent is required to hold at loast three county institutes of two days each, or one county institute of ive consecutive days. In the neaning of the law a school day consists of not less than seven hours, including intermissions and recesses.
- 2. The session of the county justitute must consist of either two days or five days, a session for less than two days not being authorized by the law.
- 3. The county superintendent is an interest zed to "cancel the cerfully and persisting himself from the count stistitute."
- 4. The county superinter Is required by the law to kee correct record of the attenda of the teachers at the county institute. This record must show the number of hours each teacher attends the county institutedur ing each day of the session. A failure to keep this fecord will prevent the extension of teachers' certificates.

Dr. Hyslop, so far as appears from quotations in the Outlook, from his testimony before the British Medical Association, deals with prayer, not as an agent for the cure of particularized physical ailments, but as a panacea for sufferings of the mind. He declares: "Of all hygienic measures to counteract disturbed sleep, depressed spirits, and all the miserable sequels of a distressed mind, I would undoubtedly give the first place to the simple habit of prayer." Creed or no creed, belief or doubt, faith or skepticism, seem so have little to do with the problem as viewed by Dr. Hyslop. It is the state of mind to which he looks, rather than the attitude of the mind toward reigious tenets. He says: "Let there but be a habit of nightly communion, not as a mendicant or repeated of words more adapted to the tongue of a sage, but as a humble individual who submerges or asserts his individuality as an integral part of a greater whole. Such a habit does more to clean the spirit and strengthen the soul to overcome mere incidental emotionalism than any other therapeutic agent known

This contained items translated from atl the European papers, and was printed upon fine poper from special type. All items which might be disposed to be disque ing to the czar were elimina by the editors, and the freshly printed sheet contained only such news as was likely to please the one subscriber.

After the commencement of the var, however, the czar insisted on also being supplied with formblacked" copies of certain En, sh papers, and these were sent finwillingly by the censors who, in times past, resorted to odd devices to keep certain publications from their imperial master, counterfeits sometimes even being printed.
