ing that Coke county citizens can procure a right-of-way and rais a bonus of $\$ 75,000$ or $\$ 100,00$ provided that said road comes too or passes through the town of Robert Lee.
The proposed lines to Robert Lee is as follows.
Menard to Miles, Robert Lee and Colorado City which is later to connect with the San Antonio $\&$ Aransas Pass on the south at Kerrville.
Another line is an extension of
the Texas Central from DeLeon in Comanchee county, to cross the Orient at Fort Chadbourne to Robert Lee, Sterling and out
through Glasscock county and on west.
Another proposition is for home capital with some outside capital which can be easily goten to cqnstruct a line from Robert Lee to Fort Chadbourne or Bronte on the Oriente, the most practicable route. A great number of our largest land own ers have expressed the willingness to give as a bonus $\$ 1$ pe acre on their land.
In this way it can readily be
seen that a sufficient amount can be raised to secure the road without much trouble.
