An Arithmetical Trick and Its Explanation.

A pleasing way to arrive at an arithmetical sum without the use of pencil or paper is to ask a person to think of a figure, then to double it, then to add to it whatever figure you suggest, then halve the whole sum and finally to subtract from that the figure first thought of. It will then be "up to" you to tell him what the remainder

The key to this lock of figures is that half of whatever sum you request to be added is sure to be the remainder.

In the following example five is half of ten, which is the number requested to be added.
