The Texas Commercial Secretaries \& Business Mens' Association is taking an active in terest in the Legislation submitted by Governor Colquitt proposing to change, the road law relating to bond issues from a two-thirds to a majority vote. It now requires a two-thirds vote to bond a county for road purposes and this handicap prevents many progressive citizens from petitioning the county for an election on bond issues.
