One of the heaviest spring wool clips in years is predicted this season and local hardware men report numerous sales of modern clipping machines, which are supplanting the old fashioned hand shears. The local warehouses are undergoing repairs incident to the handling of next season's clip and both producers and dealers are optimistic over the prespects.
