Below is an article written by Brother C. A. Lamb and published in the Megagle Times, at Megargle Texas August 22nd. where Brother Lamb is now employed.

He read with much interest our account of our trip to El Paso and return over the T. A. T. air line. Every body around here Brother Lamb got a good kick out of it, One man, Joe Turner who flew in the Army five years got aspecial kick out of it.

"Some five or six weeks ago, A. W. Puett, editor of the Robert Lee Observer, published at Rob ert Lee, Texas, went to Sweetwater to a meeting of the West Texas Press Association. He had learned that editors in attendance were to be treated to a free airplane ride, so that was the chief attaction that drew him to Sweetwater. Before the adjeurnment of the association the honored gentlemen of the press were given a chance to obtain a free ticket for an airplane trip from Sweetwater to E. Paso and re turn. Editor Puett was the lucky man, so on Friday August 9th., at 1:15 p. m., he left the earth for the second time -E Paso bound.

The Megargel Times force read with much interest his account of his trip published in his paper. It seems that he was imbued with the spirit of West Texas (which, like the rest of the world, is getting its wings), laid down his composing stick, wiped the ink off his face. packed a change of clothes in a hand-bag, went to Sweetwater. boarded a Transcontinental Air Transport plane bound westward and went all the way to El Paso and back again without receiving so much as a scratch or bruise.

His excitement had arisen to such a feverish heat that when he hit the ground for dinner he couldn't eat a bite. It seemed that when the pliot landed, the editor's heart cut a few didoes from nervousness, and his stomach turned upside down and played a tune entited, "Get Away Dinner You've Lost Your Taste."

Leaving Midland he got in the cockpit with the pilot and while the latter and he were eating candy, they discovered a cockreach on it. While trying to extricate this pestiferous insect, the plane wobbled. The pilot set it straight, but, in so doing, ate the cockrosch.

Mr. Puett, gazing earthward, discerned a narrow, ribbon-like strip but could not tell what it was. The pilot dismissed his curiosity with the information that it was the Pecos River.


