## NOW or NEVER

There are several benefits the people may expect to receive from the issuance of the proposed bond issue covering Precinct No. 1:
1st: The $\$ 25,000$ will seeure all the right-of-ways FOUR directions out of Robert Lee which will be all the right-of ways this precinct will ever be called upos to secure.
2nd. Although the bond isaue will cost the tax payers of this precinct some $\$ 2.000$ a year it will save the road and bridge fund, or Maintenance Fund, on which the country roads of this precinct depends, the same amount of money; or a like sum in this manner: From Robert Lee to the Tom Green county line, if completed under the highway program we now have going, wil' be taken over by the state for maintance, thereby saving this precinct approximately $\$ 1000$ year. Going north out of Robert Lee to the Mitchell county line, if the highway is constructed, there will only be left for county maintance that portion of road from Kobert Lee through Sanco to its intersection at the mountain with the state highway, a distance of about 15 miles plus a short cut off directly out f sanco west to an intersectien f the state highway of approxmately two miles, making a total of some 17 miles left for the county to maintain on this road compared with 36 miles without he hignway.
So why not put the money we re going to spend on the contruction of more roads instead f maintaining the presentroad.
3rd. As to thetax rate as compared with a year ago, the old bond issue cost the precinct 75 c on the the $\$ 100$ valuation. With $52.37 \%$ state aid that was granted in January, 1938, this rate has been cut to 30 c on the $\$ 100$ valuation.

The new $\$ 25,000$ bond issue. if voted, will cost 20 c on the 100 valuation; Totaling the Id issue plus the new issue to 50 c on the $\$ 100$ valuation. This 50 c will cover all costs that will ver be needed to pay off the netrest and principal of all the outstanding road bonds of this precinct.
And that is 25 c lower than it was before this program was ever started-
