The Senate committee gave a favorable report to our bill authorizing more than a million dollars to supplement allotments for rural schoois for the year 1ヶ37. 938 .
Our sub-committee heara the University of 'Texas, A. \& M. College, John Tarieton Agricultural and Mechanical Coliege North Texas Agricultural College, and Prairit View College on their budgets.
We also had a good hearing on the proposal tu inaugarce the Experiment station in the west cross-timber section. At this nearing were delegations from Brown, Comanche, Lrath, E istland, Callahan and Parker counties, and a splendid presentation of the need was made.
The House passed to us the State Bar Bill, and the Medical Practice Bili, which was amended in its passage presumably to be satisfactory to the chiropracors.
Representative R. H. Reaves introauced in the House, and i introduces in the Senate, the bill to create che Lower Concho Kiver Authority, which would set up a state agency similar to the Upper and tentral Cotorado Kıver Authorities, including in its confines Concro County: The principal purdose of thas bul is to romote fiood controi and wate conservation.
The House committee is considering sevenue raising bilis which, uuder the constatucion can only or ginate in that branch of the Legisiature. The Senate committee on Constitutionai Amendments set the two resolution proposing amendments to authorize a sales tax, for p y ment of the social security pro gram, for hearing luesday night, February 28.
