Chewing to them is a secondary process, and thereCore must be definitely encourag. ed Wher, the time has arrived for the use of hard food (and that time is at the beginning of the teetning period) the baby should be given dry toast, $\varepsilon$ weiback, or a bread crust. The masticating funetion must be encouraged dailv, if sound teeth and sturdy supporing tissue are to be formed Moreover, emphesis on adequate mastication should be mavtained throughout childhood both for proper growth and general health.
In short, everyone should realize that whether young or adult speedy eating with is inevitable accompaniment of insufficient mastication is a prastice which can give rise to conditions that in varying degrees deprive one of maximum health and sometimes even greater penalties.
