



Be it resolved by the legislature of the state of Texas: Section 1. That Sections 51a, 51b, 51c, and 51d of Article III of the constitution of the state of Texas be amended and the same are hereby amended so that the same shall hereafter consist of one section to be numbered 51a, which shall read as follows:

"Sec. 51a. The legislature shall have to be an "interior zone." That in-the power, by general laws to provide, cludes Paris, capital of the prosubject to limitations and restrictions herein contained, and such other limitations, restrictions and regulations as may by the legislature be deemed expedient for aasistance to, and for the payment of assistance

"(1) N'eedy aged persons who are actual bona fide citizens of Texas and who are over the age of sixty-five (65) years; provided that no such assistance shall be paid to any inmate of any state supported institution, while such inmate, or to any person who shall not have actually resided in lexas for at least five (5) years during the nine (9) years immediately preceding the application for such assistance and continuously for one (1) ygar immediately preceding such application; provided that the maximum payment per month from state funds shall not be more than twenty dollars (\$20) per month.

"(2) Needy blind persons who are actual bona fide citizens of Texas and are over the age of twenty-one (21) years; provided that no such assistance shall be paid to any inmate of any state supported institution, while such inmate, or to any person who shall not have actually resided in Texas at least five (5) years during the nine (9) years immediately preceding the application for such assistance and continuously for one (1) year immediately preceding such application.

"(3) Needy children who are actual bona fide citizens of Texas and are under the age of sixteen (16) years; provided that no such assistance shall be paid on account of any child over one (1) year old who has not continuously resided in Texas for one (1) year immediately preceding the application for such assistance, or on acties predicted the early unfreezing count of any child under the age of one (1) of \$1,000,000,000 of French assets in year whose mother has not continuously resided in Texas for one (1) year immedi-

ately preceding said application. "The legislature shall have the authority to accept from the federal government of the United States such financial aid for the assistance of the needy aged, needy blind, and needy children as such government may offer not inconsistent with restrictions herein set forth; provided however that the amount of such assistance out of state funds to each person assisted shall never exeeed the amount so expended out of federal funds; and, provided further that the total amount of money to be expended out of state funds for such assistance to the needy aged, needy blind, and needy children shall never exceed the sum of thirty-five million dollars (\$35,000,000) per year

Should the legislature enact enabling laws and provide an additional appropriation hereto in anticipation of the adoption of this amendment, such acts shall not be invalid by reason of their anticipatory character.

Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the qualified electors of Texas at a special election to be held throughout the state of Texas on the 25th day of August, 1945, at which election there shall be printed on such ballot the following clause:

"For the amendment to the constitution gaing the legislature the power to set up a system of payments of old age assistance to those above sixty-five (65) years of age; provided that monthly pay ments from state funds to any one person may be in valid amounts based on need, that the maximum payment per month per person from state funds shall not be more than twenty dollars (\$20) per month; giving the legislature the power to set up a system of payments for the e dy blind persons over twenty-one (21) years of age; giving the legislature the power to set up a system of payments to needy children under sixteen (16) years of age; providing f r the expenditure of funds from the federal government; limiting the total amount which may be expended for such assistance out of state funds; and providing conditions as to to residence within the state in order to become eligible to receive assistance.

## France Again Is Free Nation

### Full Recognition to Gen. De Gaulle.

WASHINGTON. - Under the leadership of aggressive Gen. Charles de Gaulle, the Republic of France emerged from four dark years of defeat, occupation and the ravages of war to take control once more of its tion already promised a position of power in the councils of peace.

Two actions by its Allies marked the renaissance of the republic:

The United States, Britain and Russia simultaneously recognized the regime of which General de Gaulle is president as a "provisional government."

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower turned over to this administration virtually all metropolitan France except the western front combat zones, by declaring the non-combat area cludes Paris, capital of the provisional government.

#### Controls Own Affairs.

Not since German invaders enveloped the shattered nation in the summer of 1940 had France attained such stature in the family of nations or such control over its own

Recognition by the three great powers was accompanied by similar action of other nations, including Canada, Australia, Brazil, Peru and Venezuela.

The United States named Jefferson Caffery as its first ambassador. He arrived in Paris recently to be a "representative" to the de Gaulle administration which until now was considered to be only a "de facto authority" rather than a government.

Immediately after announcing recognition, the United States undertook several adjustments to bring its relations with the new France in

The recognition was announced here by Acting Secretary of State Edward R. Stettinius who described it as being in harmony with American policy toward France. He noted that:

"Today the vast majority of Frenchmen are free. 

#### Milk-Made Desserts Easy on Sugar Ration

TEMPTING to the eye and pleasing to the palate, milk-made desserts can be easy on the sugar ration and kind to the budget.

That's the practical tip to homemakers given by Alice M. Cooley, director of home economics of the National Dairy Council in nationally circulated Capper's Farmer.

"Vary the popular stand-bys, custards, rice and bread puddings, by cutting their already low sugar content with sweetening of honey, ma-



Spread chocolate pudding between sponge cake layers. Sift confectioners' sugar over paper doily atop cake. Lift doily carefully.

ple sirup and corn sirup," she advises in the Rural Home section of this leading farm magazine.

"Prepare packaged cake and gingerbread mixes; try toppings of custards or fruit sauces. Add milk to packaged puddings; cook and serve chilled in pies or between layers of

"Thus with a little ingenuity a busy homemaker accomplishes three purposes. Sugar is spared, the family is pleased, and providing the day's quart for every child and a pint for every adult-is made easier.'



Try orange custard sauce on gingerbread squares. Replace 2 tbsp. of each cup of milk in custard with 11/2 tbsp. orange juice and 1/2 tsp. grated orange rind. Serve chilled.

One of the chief attractions about these milk-made desserts is their sugar-saving quality. Food authorities advise that sugar rationing may have to be retained for some months after the war's end. So, for the duration and as long thereafter as necessary, any methods the homemaker can use to save precious points will pay dividends.

A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas providing for a Supreme Court of nine members; prescribing their qualifications; and providing for their election, tenure of office and compen-

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 2 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as hereafter to read as

"Article 5, Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of a Chief Justice and eight Associate Justices, any five of whom shall constitute a quorum, and the concurrence of five shall be necessary to a decision of a casc; provided, that when the business of the court may require, the court may sit in sections as designated by the court to hear argument of causes and to consider applications for writs of error or other preliminary matters. No person shall be eligible to the office of Chief Justice or Associate Justice of the Supreme Court unless he be at the time of his election, a citizen of the United States and of this state, and unless he shall have at tained the age of thirty-five years, and shall have been a practicing lawyer, or a lawyer and judge of a court of record together at least ten years. Said Justices shall be elected (three of them each two years) by the qualified voters of the state at a general election; shall hold their offices six years, or until their successors are elected and qualified; and shall each receive such compensation as shall be provided by law, In case of a vacancy in the office of any Justice of the Supreme Court the Governor shall fill the vacancy until the next general election for state officers, and at such general election the vacancy for the unexpired term shall be filled by election by the qualified voters of the state. The Justices of the Supreme Court who may be in office at the time this amendment takes effect shall coninue in office until the expiration of their term of office under the present Constitution and until their successors are elected and qualified. The Judges of the Commission of Appeals who may be in office at the time this amendment takes effect shall become Associate Justices of the Supreme Court and each shall continue in office as such Associate Justice of the Supreme Court until January 1st next preceding the expiration of the term to which he has been appointed and until his successor shall be

elected and qualified." Sec. 2.
