## Coke County Oil Field Promising In Latest Tests

While no official report has been put out on the oil well discovery on the Allen Jameson property near Silver, it is general opinion that it is a good producing well. The Sun Company evidently has this opinion as they are now clearing ground for ocation of storage tanks, and this week have started to build roads to the sites where two or three more wells will be put down.

Indications continue highly promising for the opening of a new oil field in northwestern Coke county, although final production tests have not been made at Sun Oil company's No. 1 Allen Jameson hear Silver.
Some delay has been experienced in cleaning out the hole, after a 5 nch casing was cemented in. Last week drilling was extended down 15 feet farther beyond then original depth of 6,230 feet. The last 5 -foot core showed porosity but was a little hard at the bottom. The wildcat is reported to have recovered 560 feet of clean oil and 90 feet of oil-cut mud on a two-hour drillstem test Sunday from 6,233 to 6,240 feet. There was no water. The test was through a five eights inch bottomholechoke and a quarter op choke. Gas came to surface in nine minutes. Flowing pressure was 210 pounds. Bottomhole pressure after after a 45 -minute shutwas 3,235 pounds.
The Jameson test first showed oil in the crinoidal of the Strawn section of the Pennsylvania on a 45 -minute drillstem test Nov. 17 from 6,206 to 6,230 feet. Recovery was 500 feet of high gravity mil, gas being estimated at two A packer set last week at 6,174 feet was believed to have leaked throughout testing. The drillstem throughout testing. The drillstem
test Sunday followed. After considerable swabbing the After considerall flowed naturally Wednesday well flowed nat urally Wednesday
afternoon through open 2-inch tubafternoon through open 2 -inch tub-
ing. Tubing had been run to 6,242 feet and an unsuccessful attempt was made to set a packer. The hole was then loaded with wash water and swabbing was begun a 8 o'clock Tues day evening. With drillers estimating that considerable mud remains to be cleaned out it may be another day or two before an hour test can be made.
Some leasing activity continues, but a lull is apparent pending final report on the production. A. W. Stepp received $\$ 100$ an acre for leasing 80 acres to Sun. The tract lays just north of the Jameson test. There is also talk of royalty transactions in the making, but most folks are sitting tight for the present.
