## County Valuations Up Nearly Million; Tax Raise \$42,545

Coke county's tax bill for 1947
amounts to $\$ 124,296.56$, compared
with $\$ 81,75107$ last year, accord-
ing to records in the office of
Sheriff Paul Good, who also serves
as county tax assessor and collector,
The increase is due to a raise in
assessed valuations of nearly a
million dollars, as well as a hike in
both the state and county tax
levies. Last year the state levy was
only 37 cents on each $\$ 100$ valus.
tion, but this was increased to 72
cents for 1947. The county levy
was raised from 95 cents to . 1.05 .
As a result the state ad valorem
tax in Coke county will be $\$ 31,900$
compared with $\$ 13,245$ in 1946 .
County taxes are up to $\$ 33,544$
this year, compared with $\$ \$ 9,200$
a year ago. The road bond fund
will receive an increase of about
