Dimmitt is getting large enough that a municipal or community center building of some type is going to be on the must list. The village size town can depend on its school auditoriums or other small improvised housing facilities for its center of recreation, and which will be adequate in most cases. As towns grow to a certain size, and show all indications of continued growth, special arrange-ments must be made for facilities P. T. A. to Meet ments must be made for facilities adequate for town-wide social and recreation activities. While the ladies of the city are primarily interested in an adequate youth center building, and the youth of our land should be our first interest, there are many other di-vergent reasons why Dimmitt make provisions for a municipal building that will be adequate to take care of the recreational and cultural needs of the community. As Dimmitt grows, and there are no indications that its growth will not continue for a number of years, its trade area will naturally expand in proportion bringing into its sphere of responsibility many who are not actually residents of the immediate community. A litforesighted planning now d be of immeasurable value in the future while at the same time filling a present need. There are many types of entertainment and recreation that could be induced to appear in our city if we had the facilities to accomodate large numbers of people and then the same building could be used for the many annual events of a townwide and countywide nature. 



"Whooping cough can only be contracted by direct exposure to the disease, and isolation of cases must be universally practiced if the ircidence is to be controlled," Dr. Cox stated.

"The infectious agent or germ of whooping cough is transmitted by droplets expelled in coughing, sneezing, or speaking," Dr. Cox said. "The discharges from the nose and throat are dangerous to susceptible persons; the need for early recognition and careful isolation of whooping cough is obvious. Your family physician should be called at the first sign."

"The first symptom of this discease is usually a dry cough, which controlled," Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Damron.




